AUGUST REPORT.

Shows Continued Low Average of
Leading Crops.

Increase of Odd Fellows in State
Lawyer Fou in a Mosquito
Case. The Grave of
Maces and Its
Monument.

Raleigh, Aug. 21. The State agricultural department today issued its crop report for August. This gives the following as the present percentages of condition: Cotton 89, corn 96, tobacco 70, peas 83, sweet potato 94, late Irish potatoes 85, peanuts 69, sorghum 78, late cabbage 70. The lowest of the percentage of the leading crops, shows how unfavorable the season is yet they have declined but little since the July report. As to yield of small grains the percentages are: Wheat 81, oats 89, rye 84. The condition of fruits, etc., is given as follows: Apples 83, peaches 83, grapes 84.

Beotologist McCarthy of the agricultural department is now making the investigation as to the presence of the bacillus in the 23 cases in the insane asylum held upon which tuberculosis is alleged. The agricultural department is advised by one of its quarantine inspectors that in parts of McDowell county he finds the cattle badly infected with ticks. The government expert will cut out the infected region.

News reaches here that James T. LeGrand, one of the leading citizens of Rockingham, is dead of Bright's disease. He has served in the legislature and also as a penitentiary director.

Grand Secretary Woodell of the Odd Fellows made a statement to the Grand Master today as to the strength of the order in North Carolina. He says it approaches 9000 and that the gain this year is over 1000.

James H. Fou, a well known attorney here has gone to Greenboro to appear against a cotton mill company which is sued for manufacturing a pond which breeds mosquitoes. He has read all the latest authorities on that subject and shows up the mosquitoes as the great bearer of malarial poison.

The grave of Nathaniel Bacon, is in a field on a farm in Warren county. For many years it has been the custom of persons passing there to add a stone to the mound or cairn of stones which surrounds the grave, and the mound is a large one. There yet exists a few relics of Bacon and these it is the purpose of the State literary and historical society to secure and put in view here.

Great Stir in Tampa.

TAMPA, Fla., August 20. The intense excitement manifest in the Latin quarter creates the impression that the vigilance committee is again at work tonight. It is impossible at this time to obtain definite information. Evictions by renting agents are causing great excitement. It is believed that more than 100 women and children slept in the streets last night. The central committee of Residence Union cut down the soup house allowance to one meal a day.

Another proclamation was issued today in the name of "The People of Tampa and Surrounding Country." It urges that immediate steps be taken by all parties concerned to have the factories opened and states a determination to protect the industry of cigar manufacturers in Tampa and the employes and laborers in such factories. It closes with the statement: "We proclaim to the cigar makers that the citizens will not allow any oppression or abuse or ill treatment imposed upon them."

LIQUID AIR.

A Striking Experiment Which Will Show Its Immense Power.
A striking experiment which will show the enormous power of liquid air consists in pouring some over quicksilver which has been put into a mold having a screw eye at each end. In a moment the liquid metal becomes frozen hard, and the screw eye is firmly imbedded in it. If a cord is attached to one end and to the other a weight of 50 pounds, the weight will be suspended for 15 or 20 minutes at the ordinary temperature before the metal is thawed sufficiently to allow the screw eye to be pulled out, and nearly as long a time again elapses before the quicksilver returns to its ordinary liquid state. Alcohol, which, as no one can forget, is used for measuring degrees of extreme cold, as it does not freeze until about 190 degrees C., is easily converted into what is practically alcohol ice when liquid air is poured into it. First of all, however, it becomes as thick as tripe and when lifted out of the cooling vessel can be still further frozen when left in it.
