LYNCHINGS.

Governor Aycock Says They Increase Crime.

Rainfall and Temperature During July. State Charter. North Carolina's Claims Against War Department. Marion Butler's Party.

RALEIGH, Aug. 23.—The weather report for the State for July, issued today, says the monthly mean was 78.8 degrees, which is 1.3 above normal. The highest was 89.1 at Washington, the lowest 68.4 at Linville and Highlands. The highest absolute temperature was 105, at Washington, the lowest 48, at Linville. The average rainfall was 6.59 inches, an inch above normal. The district averages were: Eastern 7.75, central 7.98, western 4.31. The greatest was 19.38 inches, at Southern Pines, and of this 8 inches fell in 24 hours.

Gov. Aycock's very positive declaration that lynchings increase crime, instead of suppressing it, is read with interest. The lynching at McParland is to be investigated. The question is whether any grand jury would do anything in such a case. In Rutherford county two grand juries ignored the bills against well known persons, and the matter of investigation and trial simply had to end.

The State charters the Page Lumber Company, of Gastonia, capital \$200,000, J. E. Page and others stockholders.

The State officials are very anxious that the State's remaining claims against the war department for expenditures, etc., in connection with the Spanish-American war, be settled. When the war came on Gov. Russell announced that the State would not expend a cent, nor did it, but it took charge of the claims of various officers and of contractors for supplies, etc. Now it appears, the war department desires the State to really pay these and make certificate of that fact for reimbursement.

President James A. Bryan of the Atlantic and North Carolina railway is here. He says that despite the long continued rains the physical condition of the road is excellent, save at a few low places. Work begins next week at these points. He says the rains reduced the freight receipts at least \$15,000. During the first 23 days of July it rained daily. The annual meeting of the directors will be held at New Bern September 4.

Ex-Senator Marion Butler, Populist State Chairman, has sent out a circular to his headmen, telling him to hold their organization intact for the battle of 1902 and not to identify themselves with or affiliate with either the Democratic or Republican party. A Republican remarks regarding this that Butler's party is now only on paper and can't poll 10,000 votes. He says further that as there are 100,000 Populists in the east than white Republicans the ex-Senator hopes to make them the controlling power in that section.

There is gratifying improvement today in the condition of General Passenger Agent Busch of the Seaboard Air Line, whose critical illness here has been referred to.

At yet it is not definitely settled where several of the pennant games between the Raleigh and Wilmington base ball teams will be played. Raleigh still tomorrow see the last game here.

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 23.—The North American newspaper will use "Control of the Norfolk & Western Railway" as passed to the hands of the Pennsylvania Railroad, and is likely to be the great of the South interests. This was announced yesterday as a fact but will probably occur several months later in financial and political circles. Many other smaller announcements made this year. The South interests, it is asserted, now hold an actual majority of the capital stock of the Norfolk & Western. It is said that the Pennsylvania interests own about \$10,000,000 out of the \$20,000,000 preferred stock, and \$15,000,000 out of the \$20,000,000 common stock.

FLAGLER-KENAN WEDDING.

Florida's Multi-Millionaire Rakes \$1,000,000 Present to the State.

PHILADELPHIA, August 23.—A special to The Record from Wilmington, N. C., says: The marriage of Miss Mary Lily Kenan, of Wilmington, and Henry M. Flagler, of Florida, the multi-millionaire oil magnate, about which so much gossip has been going on for the past year, will take place Saturday, August 24, at Kenansville, N. C.

Kenansville, where the ceremony will be performed, is situated ten miles from Raleigh, the nearest railroad station, on the Wilmington & Weldon Railroad, and can only be reached by private conveyance. Here is the old Kenan homestead, where the bride-deer was born. During the past summer it has been thoroughly renovated and refurbished, preparatory to the coming nuptials. The wedding reception to be a very simple affair, but only members of the Kenan family and a small circle of intimate friends will be allowed to view the grandeur. The ceremony will be performed according to the rites of the Presbyterian Church, of which Mr. Flagler is an elder and the Kenan family members.

Mr. Flagler is scheduled to arrive in Wilmington tomorrow. He will remain there during the night and leave early Saturday morning on a special train over the Atlantic Coast Line for Kenansville and thence by private conveyance to Kenansville, where the ceremony will be performed upon his arrival.

The party is a very remarkable one, the details of which it is impossible to get through remote newspaper columns. The bride is a lovely girl, and the groom is a well known man, and the wedding will be one of the most magnificent of the season.
