RALEIGH, December 20.—The report of the State Board of Public charities shows that there are 763 inmates of the hospital for the insane at Morganton; 430 in the hospital at Raleigh and 461 in that at Goldsboro; total 1,644. The percentage of mortality at Morganton was 3½, at Raleigh 10, at Goldsboro 8.88. The rcentage of cures to admissions is 47 Morganton, 67 at Raleigh, 38 at Goldsoro. During the year admission was denied, for lack of room, to 238 persons There are 353 pupils in the institution for the white blind and that for negro deaf-mutes and blind here. Of these 187 are white. There are 200 children in the State who ought to be in these institutions. At the school for deaf-mutes at Morganton there are 210 pupils.
