BADLY OFF.

Farmers Who Will be Unable to Continue Work.

The Governor's Engagements. Seaboard Plans. A Christmas Dividend. Young Contesting Against Nancy Good Roads Object Lessons.

RALPHON, Jan. 4.—Governor today accepted an invitation to address the Junior Order of American Mechanics at Durham January 20th; also invited to speak at Southern Pines February 20th, where a reception in his honor will be given, and at Trinity College, Durham, February 22.

The Seaboard Air Line continues to make changes here. In less than a year it has had six masters mechanics in charge of its shops here. The number employes at these shops has been increased quite recently and it is now claimed there are 85.

The Citizens' National bank of Raleigh gives its stockholders a pleasant Christmas gift in the shape of a special 2 per cent dividend, separate and apart from its regular dividend.

Mr. Samuel Watts, a well known farmer and merchant of this county, says that a large number of persons who farmed last year will not be able to do so this year, as they have no food for their stock and prices are so high that it will not pay merchants to advance to them. He says many of them will have to seek employment as laborers, and their children take service in factories or in families.

W. S. Wilson, corporation clerk in the office of the Secretary of State has in press a compendium of the corporation laws of the State, these covering all classes of corporation.

The State charters the Mission Hospital training school for nurses, at Asheville, and the Snow Bird Lumber Company of Asheville, with \$150,000 capital owned by Philadelphians.

The news that James H. Young, colored, of Raleigh who for some years has had State army and revenue positions, is fighting the appointment of John C. Dancy, as Recorder of Deeds of the District of Columbia is read with interest. J. C. L. Harris, a well known white republican of this city, has been to Washington in Young's interest.

Various chapters of the Daughters of the Confederacy are furnishing rooms in the new dormitory at the Soldiers Home here. All the rooms in the west wing are assigned, as follows: "Dodson-Rameur," of Concord; "W. C. Stronach," of Raleigh; "Thomas Ruffin," of Goldsboro; "New Bern"; "Durham"; "Lincoln"; "A. B. Gorrell," of Winston; "Winnie Davis," of Pittsboro; "W. H. C. Whiting," of Wilmington; "Hillsboro Hall"; "A. M. Scales," of Greensboro. The rooms in the east will now be assigned.

The "Good Roads Train" will be here in February and the working force will grade a new macadam street in the city as an object lesson.

John C. Drevry, who has been the cause of all the street improvements made here has resigned as an alderman. He did a great work for Raleigh. Street work has practically been stopped since last June, when a proposition for issue of bonds was voted down.

The board of aldermen makes a \$1,200 annual appropriation to the Olivia Roney free library and of \$3,000 to the Rex hospital but will require the latter to do better work.
