**BIG FIRE AT TRENTON.**

S. Barker's Gin, Grist and Saw Mills, and Warehouse Destroyed. Total Loss.

Mr. J. P. Brogden, of Trenton, Jones county, who was in the city, yesterday, said that the fire at Trenton was discovered about 4 a. m. Wednesday, but it had gotten under such headway, that it could not be extinguished.

The fire is supposed to have started from the furnace in the saw mill.

The property destroyed all belonged to Mr. S. Barker, and consisted of three cotton gins, a grist mill, saw mill, and warehouse containing cotton and guano. The property burned is a total loss, there being no insurance upon it.
