RALEIGH.

Report of Negro Murder in Wake County.

Rains Ended Drought Farm Laborers Scarce. Only 58 Convicts in the Penitentiary. State Library is Being Repaired.
RALEIGH, June 25.—The attendance at the annual meeting of the State liquor dealers' association, in session here, is very small. Last evening the "board of control," or executive committee was in session. The general public expected that there would be a large attendance.
All this State's exhibits at the Charleston exposition are back in the museum and part are being unpacked. There will be a very extensive rearrangement of the exhibits and of course an enlargement. There are a large number of new cases. Agricultural products will be admirably and most effectively shown.
The fine rains yesterday and last night have entirely ended the drought in this State. They came at the very best time. Crops are clean and were ready for the greatest benefit. The crop report for the State issued yesterday, was the most satisfactory in several weeks, and that next Tuesday will no doubt be even more gratifying.
News reached the sheriff today of a possible homicide in this county near Neuse, where a large force of negroes are building a branch line from the Seaboard Air-Line to a cotton mill. A negro named Kirby was shot in the back of the head by another named Moore. The latter asserts that the shooting was accidental, but contrary statements are made. A deputy sheriff was sent to arrest Moore.
Many sportsmen arrived here today to take part in the inter-state shoot at clay pigeons.
The State library is being refitted and is closed for several days.
There are now only 58 convicts in the penitentiary proper, all the others being at work outside. Never before was there such a demand for convict labor.
Farmers in this section say labor, by which they mean negro labor, is very scarce and that it is daily growing scarcer. Negro farm laborers are leaving for the North without the least notice. Had it been a wet year the crops would have been largely over run with grass, but it is such a dry season that very little labor is required to keep them clean.
There are fewer registered whiskey distilleries in operation now in both the districts in this state than in the past four years. The high price of corn is the chief cause, and the next is the fact that the revenue officers have watched these distilleries with unusual closeness. A great many of this class of distilleries admit frauds, and when they are so cornered that they cannot convict them they shut down. It is said by revenue officers that there is not a registered distillery which had not defrauded the government. It is merely a question of being able to detect the fraud.

A Clever Thief.

The examination will be held June 23, at New Bern, in the Graded School building and will be upon reading, writing, spelling, arithmetic, algebra, history, geography and English grammar.
