## RALEIGH.

### Grand Lodge of Masons to Build Temple.

Railroad Representatives Meeting. Heavy Wind and Hail. Vines and Trees Blown Down. More Educational Rail- ties, Arranging for State Fair.

RALEIGH, June 22.—Today representatives of the minor lines of railway in the State met here, at the Park hotel, to consider the matter of adopting the new system of paying for the use of cars on the per diem instead of the mileage basis.

The Grand Lodge of Masons is now at work in earnest and in the right way, to have a temple. In 1897 the Grand Lodge decided to have a temple and appointed a committee to erect it, but gave the committee no power. The Grand Lodge has not limited itself to the amount of stock it will take in the temple. There will be \$50,000 of 1st mortgage 5 per cent bonds and a like amount of 2nd mortgage bonds. Of course the 1st mortgage bonds can be sold anywhere, in New York, for instance. Charlotte offers to take them, and also offers to take \$10,000 of the 2nd mortgage bonds. As yet neither Greensboro nor Raleigh has made any proposition.

There was more rain last night, accompanied by an electric and wind storm. Some telegraph and telephone wires were blown down, and damage was done to a few trees.

State superintendent of public instruction Joyner returned today from Wilson, where he spoke yesterday at a very large educational meeting. He says that among those present were 100 school commissioners.

Gov. Aycock returned this morning from Harmony, Iredell county, where he spoke on education. He will not make any speeches during July, but will remain here. In August he will make a short tour in the mountain section.

Arrangements for the next State Fair, in October, are thus early very active. There will be new features. Many improvements of buildings are being made. This is the greatest fair south of Hagerstown, Md., and has become noted far and near.

Several cannons and mortars, to be placed in the grounds of the capital and soldiers' home will soon arrive here; also a number of large shells.

### Wake Endorses Clark.

## TELEGRAPHIC BREVETTES.

The sum of \$45,000 has been appropriated by Congress to pay the late President McKinley's doctors.

The Bell Telephone Co. has been refused a franchise in the town of Henderson.

The carpenters of Norfolk have struck and all building enterprises of the city have been "held up" on that account.

A remarkable cold wave prevailed throughout the country the first of the week. Snow fell in several localities.

The Penn., Democratic State Convention nominated ex-Gov. Robert Pattison for governor. He has been elected governor twice.

Gov. A. T. Biles was renominated on the Republican ticket at the State Convention in Michigan.

The Governor of Maryland has issued an order making July 5, a holiday this year.

President Roosevelt and family have gone to Oyster Bay, N. Y., for the summer vacation.

### Industrial North Carolina.

J. Q. Gaunt & Sons expect to erect a cotton mill at Burlington.

The Proximity Manufacturing Co. will own and operate a 60,000 spindle and 2,000 loom mill at Greensboro. Denims will be the principal article manufactured. The plant is to cost \$1,250,000.

The Monbo Cotton Mill has increased its capital from \$50,000 to \$60,000 and will make additions to its equipment.

Brick and Tile works have been established at Teachup, capital \$10,000.

The Aberdeen and Rockfish railway is being rapidly constructed to Fayetteville. John Blue is the principal owner.

The James River Railway Co. has been organized at Norfolk, Va. Congressman H. L. Maynard is president.

The Washington & Portsmouth Ry. has not been purchased by the Pennsylvania Ry. Co.
