RALEIGH.

Complaints as to Character Admissions to Insane Asylum.

Old Soldier Dead. Dry in Wake County. Rural Public Libraries. Ball Players Make Good. Motive Power at A. & M. College.

RALEIGH, July 28.—William A. Gayin, of Samson county, died today in the Soldiers Home here, aged 70. He went there 4 months ago with cancer. He was in the 51st regiment.

State superintendent of public instruction Joyner returned here today after three weeks illness at Greensboro.

The crops in three-fourths of the area of this county are suffering for rain. Today warrants for libraries for rural public schools were sent out to Harnett, Moore and Halifax counties. As yet 19 counties, among them so important a county as Buncombe, have not made application for these libraries.

Arrangements are now being made to install motive power for the machinery in the textile building at the Agricultural and Mechanical College. For lack of such power the machinery could not be operated last session.

Judge and Mrs. Purnell have gone to Wytheville, Va., to remain three weeks. The baseball enthusiasts here are delighted with the work of the players who have gone to the Southern league from the North Carolina league. All have done well and their playing shows how fast the State league was in 1901-02.

The outlook for a good tobacco market here was never so promising as at present. Buyers are arriving. The season will open regularly next Friday.

There is complaint by officials here and by the general public as well that inmates are received at the insane asylum, while meritorious inmates are excluded. The case of a man now in jail here illustrates the complaint. It is said the asylum is overcrowded. "Make room; it can be made," say the county officials.
