TELEGRAPHIC BRIEVITIES.

The Republican campaign text book for 1908 has been issued. It ignores the principal issues under discussion.

The cholera epidemic is subsiding in Manila, but increasing in the other parts of the islands.

Germany will increase her naval force by 35,000 men.

Twenty students, young men and women have been expelled from the Northwestern University at Evanston, Ill., for immorality and gambling.

Archbishop Ireland of the Catholic church has made a sensation by defending the United States government in the expulsion of the Friars from the Philippine Islands.

An eloping couple have undertaken to walk from Richmond, Va., to Dayton O. The man was 27 years of age and the lady 17. They had very little money.

New York people were thoroughly frightened Sunday by the appearance of a very black cloud which lowered over the city. A terrific storm of wind and hail occurred causing considerable damage.

The Russian government denies that it is making war on American sugar.

Mrs. Nell Campbell, the Chicago woman arrested for starving a child was arraigned before the criminal court Monday and it was ascertained that she had been carrying on her nefarious business of killing small children. She has been known to have caused the death of nine infants.

Commodore Joseph Montgomery, a Confederate Naval Commander is dead at the home of his son in Chicago. He was one of the most prominent of Southern naval fighters and had the distinction of having nearly captured Gen. Grant.

At the Vance county Republican convention, Monday, colored men conducted the entire proceedings. Only one white delegate was present and he did nothing but yote.

Captain McRea, of the gunboat Machias, has cabled the Navy Department that the outbreak in Hayti is practically over.

R. Hoe & Co., manufacturers of printing presses, have been served with summons and complaint in a suit for \$35,000 damages brought by Rudolph Gartenburg, who alleges that while acting as a pull-bearer at the funeral of Rabbi Joseph he was struck by a brick in the hands of one of Hoe & Co's employees.

A cyclone visited St. Catherine, Ont., and caused great destruction, several were killed.

The Coachmen's Union of Trenton, N. J., have declared against the custom of driving for Sunday christenings, weddings and funerals.

"The battle is still being fought desperately," is the word received at the State department from Colombia, South Africa. The civil and insurgent troops are at fierce war. The place of the engagement is at Agua Dulce and the rebels are the attacking party. The government troops are the strongest, however.

It is estimated that between 100,000 and 200,000 visitors are at Atlantic City, N. J. The hotels and boarding houses are crowded almost beyond their capacity and in some cases tents have had to be put up.

There is much disgust expressed by people of Charlotte because a merry-go-round was allowed to operate at Latta Park Sunday. Several arrests have been made and there is an exciting time promised.

RALEIGH, Aug. 5.—The state election board was again in session today. Yesterday it elected the Republican member of each of the county boards. Today it elected the two Democratic members on each of these boards.

The Democratic executive committee met here today, to elect a chairman and secretary.

The pardon of Daley, one of the three "gold brick" swindlers, is not at all relished by the public. All the comments on it heard today were unfavorable.

It appears that there are in the insane hospital here about 80 idiots, imbeciles, dotards, etc., who really ought to be in the county homes, to make way for curable insane. There are a number of violent cases which need treatment. The directors meet tomorrow and will consider this matter. They are giving more and more attention to it. It needs earnest and prompt action.

It is learned that the sawmill of B. F. Aycock, a brother of the governor, near Pikeville, Wayne county, was burned last night.

Adolphus Russell, a young sailor, who deserted from his ship at Norfolk and returned to his home here, was nabbed last night and was sent back this morning. Last week Alonzo Alford was caught here and sent back.

Gentlemen from Edgecombe county who are here say the crops are suffering from drought, and assure me that a good rain has not fallen since May 1. Mention was made of the fact that of the 12,000 children of school age in Robeson county 3,049 can neither read nor write. Bad as this State of affairs is, it is better than in the State at large. In that county only one child in 6 can not read or write. "State Superintendent Joyner said today, "In the State at large on an average one white child in four can neither read nor write." The publication in regard to illiteracy in Robeson is attracting attention. What the State Superintendent now says will attract even more.
