### County Commissioners.

The meeting held on 10:30 o'clock pursuant to a writ made to consider the small pox situation.

Present Commissioners, Jones, Wood, Wadsworth, Wood, Felcher and Mrs. Duff and Bagley.

On motion it is ordered that commissioners K. H. Jones and J. J. Baxter be and are appointed a committee to confer with Dr. N. H. Stans, the Superintendent of Health in regard to the care and attention of the small pox cases and arrange and propose methods and means of meeting the situation caused by the outbreak of small pox.

Ordered by the County Board that it shall be unlawful for any person or persons in Craven county to refuse to be vaccinated when the County Superintendent of Health shall advise that such person or persons be vaccinated. Any person violating this rule shall be fined not exceeding \$50 or imprisoned not exceeding 30 days.

Ordered by the Board that the County furnish such vaccine virus as may be needed to the County Superintendent of Health and in all cases where vaccinations is compulsory or charged, and in compulsory cases no charges to be made by the County Superintendent of Health.

Sanitary Board adjourned.

The Board of Commissioners met in regular session.

Present Commissioners, Jones, Wood, Baxter, Wadsworth and Felcher.

The bill of W. A. Wilcox for \$38.25 for keeper Street's Ferry and extra work on the Ferry house was allowed.

Board took recess.

Board met at 3 p. m. pursuant to recess.

Present Commissioners, Jones, Wood, Wadsworth, Felcher and Baxter.

Whereas, at the meeting of the Board in May 1901, the County Commissioners at the request of many magistrates of the county adopted the provisions of chapter 50, laws of 1901, the same being the road law for Craven county, and whereas, now various other magistrates request the repeal of the law, it is ordered by the Board that the former order of the Board adopting the law be and the same is hereby reconsidered and repealed.

Commissioners Baxter, Wood and Felcher and Wadsworth voting to repeal.

Commissioner Jones voting against repeal.

The bill of G. V. Richardson for furnishing rations to Furphy Hawkins for five months, being \$12.50 was allowed.

Ordered that Ed Ballenger be requested to furnish \$1.50 per month in rations to Geo. Hill.

The bill of K. K. Bryan, list taker of No. 3 township was allowed, a balance of \$25.00 for work on tax list which was accepted and turned over to the Register of Deeds.

The Board proceeded to draw a jury to serve at a term of Superior Court to be held on the 2nd Monday after the first Monday in September being the 15th day of September.
