TELEGRAPHIC BREVITIES.

The hop crop in Washington State is one-fifth short.

The President's yacht Sylph left New York for Washington, D. C., yesterday.

Work on sky-scrappers of Chicago, Ill., was suspended Monday owing to the strike of 800 structural-iron workers.

The new political party in Montgomery, organized by F. Augustus Helms, will be known as the Anti-Trust Democracy.

Republicans at San Juan, P. R., attacked a Federal meeting Sunday, many persons being hurt through the invasion of the police in preventing the clash.

Pennsylvania strikers threaten the use of dynamite.

Henderson county has been sued to recover \$100,000 by parties of Connecticut who claim that they bought bonds and have not realized anything on them.

Secretary of the Treasury Shaw has made a statement that the banks will not be required to carry a reserve against Government deposits secured by Government bonds. This action makes available \$30,000,000 and relieves the stringency which the banks have suffered.

RALEIGH.

Lawyers Profess No Surprise On Wilcox Matter.

Cotton Picked. Croatan Indian Schools Report. State Guard Supplies. Seeking Sugar Beet Land By Northern Investors.

RALEIGH, Oct. 1.—Some lawyers profess that they feel no surprise at the granting of a new trial to James Wilcox convicted of the murder of Miss Crosey, and say they do not see how the court could have refused the new trial. There was surprise here today as the public attitude towards Wilcox since this new development.

It is said that in this section 75 to 85 per cent of the cotton is already picked. More of it opened than was expected, thanks to admirable weather.

Attorney General R. D. Gilmer returned today from Waynesville and in two or three days will make a brief tour for the purpose of making some campaign speeches.

A report on the Croatan Indian schools in Robeson county, was received today by State Superintendent Joyner. There are 1784 children of school age, but of these only 771 are enrolled, while the average attendance is but 438. The number between the ages of 12 and 21 years who cannot read or write is no less than 444, this being an extremely bad showing. There are 21 public school districts and 13 teachers of the Croatan race, who this year were paid \$1715. There are 63 Croatan pupils. Croatan property is worth only \$153,883.

Almost all the supplies for the State Guard have arrived here. They will make the equipment very complete. There are considerable additions to the field equipment. The force is anxiously awaiting the passage by Congress of the national guard bill, which will put the force on a vastly different footing.

The State Auditor has received only one application for a new pension from Wilkes county. The pension lists are now closed. There is more than two months work to get the something like 11,500 warrants ready.

Inquiry is made of the State agricultural department regarding lands in North Carolina suitable for the sugar beet. New York and Rhode Island capitalists make the inquiry.
