Market Letter on Cotton.

New York, Nov. 6.—We have to record a further decline with new low records in all options, but while the market was weak, evidence of a further break are not as numerous as yesterday. In fact a great deal of cotton was picked up on the belief that January would break. A great many traders have the idea that it breaks sharply on the opening. On such a break enough cotton is likely to come out to clear the situation and any buying tends to bring about a recovery, following this, buying was good this a. m. Early buyers then sold and the tone grew nervous rather than weak. Liquidation was a feature of the day, cotton coming out on every rally. This supplied buying orders and prevented much of an advance. The undertone however did not seem as weak as yesterday. Prices are down near the level in Southern markets and a break to below 8.14 is likely to result in less selling of actual cotton in New York.

Henry M. Nell of New Orleans places the total crop at 11,500,000 to 12,000,000 bales as against 10,800,000 last year. The total Atlantic States are given at 4,800,000 to 4,900,000 as against 4,300,000 bales. The total Gulf States 8,900,000 to 4,000,000 against 5,770,000 and total Texas and Indian Territory 5,500,000 to 8,600,000 against 2,977,000. Regarding the crop he says: "The crop which is a very early one made fine progress up to August 1st, excepting the Montgomery and Atlantic districts, which suffered from lack of rains in June and July. August was dry comparatively, but September gave ample rains. The benefit arising from favorable weather in September and October, and the absence of a killing frost, has been great, and we now fairly form an estimate."

The statistics of the quantity of cotton ginned 80.1 per cent, were collected through a personal individual canvass by paid local agents of the census office. The estimate of percentage is based on estimates of these agents. The office assumes no responsibility however for their accuracy. The report will be followed by a second, showing the cotton ginned up to December 1st and a third and a final report in the early spring.

## DAKOTA BOND SUIT.

### Testimony Being Taken in This Notable Case.

State Board of Elections. Governor's Sick Children. Libraries For Rural Public Schools. State Charters. County Superintendents Conference.

RALEIGH, November 6.—This morning, before Edward S. Battle, special commissioner, the taking of testimony in the notable bond suit case of South Dakota against North Carolina began in the office of attorney general Gilmer. That official was present, as were also his associate counsel, James E. Shepherd, of Raleigh, James H. Merrimon of Asheville and George Rountree of Wilmington. The State of South Dakota was represented by ex-Gov. D. L. Russell and J. C. L. Harris. Several witnesses were examined, among those being Gov. Aycock, treasurer Lacy, ex-treasurers Kemp P. Battle and W. H. Worth, ex-chief clerk Denmark of the State treasury, Dr. J. J. Mott of Statesville. Dr. Battle was State treasurer in 1896 when the bonds out of which the suit arises were issued. South Dakota claims the face of the bonds and interest. The bonds were "sealed under the act of 1879. South Dakota also claims that these bonds issued in aid of the Western N. C. R. R., are a lien upon the North Carolina R. R.

Today was the principal day at the negro State Fair here and the attendance was large. The exhibit is equal to the best ever made at one of these Fairs, and the negroes manifest much pride in it.

The State board of elections met here today, to re-organize. It will canvass the returns. The county boards all over the State met today. Wilson G. Lamb of Williamston, R. T. Claywell of Morganton, J. R. Lowellen, of Dobson, Clarence Cole, of Wilkes, and A. B. Freeman of Hendersonville compose the State board.

Dr. Albert Anderson arrived at the executive mansion last night from the Wilson Sanitarium with Miss Ormond, a trained nurse, who takes charge of the two sick children of the Governor, Louise and Connor, both of whom have fever. Dr. Anderson says it is yet too soon to say whether the disease is typhoid fever.

This week the State agricultural department issues a "pure food" bulletin, which ought to be carefully read.

Today the agricultural department sent out the question blanks for the November crop bulletin, the last one to be issued this year.

Today the State Superintendent of public instruction sent out warrants for 18 free libraries for rural public schools—6 for Yancey and one each for Macon, Mecklenburg, Mitchell, and Perquimans and 2 for Haywood.

Up to date 85 county superintendents say they will attend their State Conference here next Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. The State Superintendent wrote a strong letter to the others, urging them to come.

A charter is granted by the State to the Piedmont Telephone and Telegraph Company of Gastonia, capital \$30,000. The Kingston & Carolina R. R. is chartered with \$50,000.

## OLYMPIA.

Nov. 6.—Well there seems to be some rain on hand as we are having a small shower this morning which makes some of our farmers sorry on account of housing potatoes and peas. Cotton is about all in and the crops good, some few are through gathering corn.

Since our last items some of our boys have made some phenomenal marks in regards to winning the fair "sex." The young man who met with the bad loss recently has begun fishing in the wild West. Now there is no danger we hope.

Miss Edith Bennett of Arapahoe is visiting friends at Olympia this week. Misses Lons and Lucy Holton have gone to Arapahoe, Oriental, Payboro, Hoboken, Lovings and several other points.

There is a few of our people sick of vaccination we are sorry such is the case but some think if people were not so scared about this disease it would not be half so bad.

Tuesday was election day at Olympia this was the quietest day we have had for a long time on election day. We think there were about 18 votes cast during the day. Weak isn't it?
