CHILD LABOR BILL.

Mill People Expected to Oppose It.

State Entomologist Finds San Jose Scale. Trinity College Library Opening. State Guard Convention. Reward For Utley.

RALPH, February 6.—State Labor Commissioner, Varner, was interviewed today regarding the Child Labor law, the first hearing on which was had yesterday before the Senate and House committees. Mr. Varner was asked whether he thought a labor bill would pass. He replied, "I think so. I feel more hopeful than I did last night. The mills will make a desperate fight against any law. I think this is united action on the part of the mill men, and through the organization they have. They oppose any legislation because they say it is an entering wedge. The sentiment of the State is greatly in favor of a conservative law regulating this matter."

In the course of an interview today with Franklin Sherman, the State entomologist, who has just returned from an inspection of orchards. He was asked if there was much San Jose scale in the State. He replied, "There is plenty of scale so far as I now know, it exists in about 80 different localities, on about 150 premises, and on something like 60,000 trees. Peaches are most affected; apples next. I know of scale in three localities west of the Blue Ridge, these being, Hillsboro, Waynesville and Mica. I found plenty of scale in the Hughes Peach orchard of 4,000 trees near Greensboro; I also found scale pretty nearly everywhere in the vicinity of Ellenboro and Shelby; As I have said it is pretty evenly distributed over the State."

The formal opening of the Trinity College Library at Durham, the gift of Mr. J. B. Duke, of New York, takes place February 23rd. Hon. Armistead Burrill, of Charlotte makes the presentation address; President John C. Kilgo, the address of acceptance; Mr. Walter M. Page, Editor of the World's Work, of New York, the dedicatory address. The exercises occur in Craven Memorial Hall at 8 p. m. and will be followed by a reception.

The total amount of reward for Edward L. Utley, the murderer of Hollinsworth at Fayetteville, is made \$1,000 by the \$400 which Governor Aycock offers.

Every company and division in the State University will be represented here at the Officers Convention next week. Great interest is manifested in the New National Militia Law. The illustrations of the new uniforms for the army, which later on will be those for the volunteers also, have been received by the Adjutant General.

Lawyers generally appear to endorse the bill of Senator Webb giving judges power to limit the length of speeches by counsel, except in trials of capital cases. The Raleigh bar has formally endorsed the bill.

Hotel Bill Liability to Guests.

Drowned in New River.

William Quinn of Marions with a companion were in a small boat on New River Thursday and were overturned off Cedar Point. When the boat upset the men managed to get on the upper part. Mr. Quinn concluded to try to swim ashore as he felt confident he would be able to do it. The water was rough with a stiff wind blowing and the task would have been a difficult one for an expert swimmer and the river is very wide at that point. Mr. Quinn sank before reaching shore while his companion was saved as the boat drifted ashore after a time.

The Loss of a Horse.

The loss of a horse, which exerted a tremendous influence in the history and reign of Henry VIII. of England. After the fall of Anne Boleyn the papacy prepared overtures of reconciliation so favorable to the King that he concluded to accept them. A representative was sent from Rome with the dispatches, and when only a day's journey from Calais the horse cast a shoe and fell lame. As the horse was a favorite animal, the messenger determined to wait for a day rather than take the chances of losing the horse. The next day the journey was resumed and London was reached to find that Henry that day had been married to Jane Seymour, a Protestant, that Anne had been beheaded the day before, and all hope of a reconciliation was lost. The messenger was a day too late, and the horse had changed the bent of the nation's history.
