AGAIN THE PISTOL.

Brings Death and Causes Dismay at Tarboro.

Dr. Julian M. Baker Kills Dr. Bass. Both Prominent Physicians. Long Standing Feud Due to Jealousy.

Special to Journal. TARBORO, N. C., March 16.—Today Dr. Julian M. Baker, a leading physician, shot and mortally wounded Dr. H. T. Bass.

There had been a feud between the men for a long time, and several months ago Bass, who weighs 300 pounds and is an athlete, knocked Baker down.

Professional jealousy is said to be the prime cause of the shooting.

Baker was in charge of a private hospital here. Bass made charges against him which the Board of Health and trustees investigated and dismissed.

A few days ago there was another difficulty in the court house. Friends intervened and prevented further trouble, but they tried in vain to effect a reconciliation.

Bass is about 67 years old and was second only to Baker as a physician. Dr. Baker married a daughter of Judge Howard.

The shooting threw Tarboro into intense excitement all day.
