The meeting is designed to be stimulating and profitable to all interested in Sunday School work and it is desired that large audiences will avail themselves of the opportunities to be afforded.

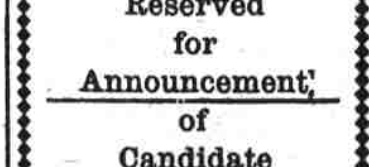
