Market Letter on Cotton.

By Private Wire to J. E. Latham & Co. New York, April 1.--The census report was a surprise to the trade. After figures were issued to a crop of 10,350,000 bales in December, a yield of about 10,000,000 bales had been expected. In place of this figures were 11,078,000. This started a general selling and prices broke rapidly. The figures include round bales, and round bales are only half bales. The standard bales amounted to some 10,800,000, according to the estimate. We fall to see where the report is bullish or bearish. The trade needs over eleven million bales and every one thinks the crop will prove about that figure. The Government report in December, as you remember, showed a crop of 10,000,000 bales, and the price broke 2 points, only to go up 2 cents later. The influence of this report is likely to be short lived. It will take cotton to break the market.

We have said factors favor a gradual decline market, but this means to short August on advances, not decline. On a recovery of 15 or 20 points the best thing seems to be a sale again. We think best to take in profits and wait until the May pool try to get prices up again before selling.

THE GOVERNOR'S JOKE.

Rainfall Was Heavy in Some Sections.

N. C. National Guards Representatives at St. Louis. Marriage Announcement. War Department Asked For An Officer. Oyster Beds Examination.

RALPH, April 1.--Today Associate Justice Henry G. Connor administered the oath of office to Eugene C. Beddingfield as corporation commissioner. Three oaths are taken, one of these being that the oath takers is not a holder of any stock in any common carrier, now the agent or attorney of any such.

Maj. Thomas Staples Fuller is appointed one of the two representatives of the North Carolina National Guard on the staff of Gen. Corbin, U. S. A., at the formal dedication of the St. Louis Exposition April 30. Surgeon Buxton Hunter of King's Mountain is the other representative.

Private Secretary Peasall returned to day from a visit to Jones county and says he never saw the county under water to such an extent. Fields in which he never before saw water are now covered.

Representative E. L. Daughtridge of Edgecombe, who came in this morning, says the floods have done some damage in that section, having carried away four of the Tar river bridges in Edgecombe and one in Nash. He says the river was higher than since 1890.

Cards have been received here to the wedding of Miss Kate Anrum Barr, daughter of Mrs. Isaac T. Avery of Morganton, to Mr. Clarence Johnson of Gastonia, a son of Mr. D. T. Johnson of Raleigh, April 10 being the date. At Littleton tomorrow Miss Mary Oliver Black, a daughter of the late Rev. William S. Black of the North Carolina M. E. Conference, will be married to Mr. Thomas Peil Grant.

Early this morning about 80 of the young lady students of Peace Institute marched in a body to the executive mansion and called on Gov. Aycock for an April 1st speech. The Governor said in honor of the day he would turn the tables on them by making no speech at all, at which there was a great laugh.

Application is made by Gov. Aycock to the War Department for the detail of an officer of the army at military headquarters here. A State having over 2000 men in the National Guard is entitled to an officer. This State has more than that number.

During the year ended yesterday the receipts of the Raleigh post office increased 11 per cent.

Today an examination of oyster beds in this State was begun by R. E. Coker in Core and Pamlico sounds. Next month Mr. Laney will begin a systematic examination of the building stones in the State and Mr. Watson of the copper ore beds.
