BARQUE STRANDED.

The Victoria VII wrecked in the Ocracoke Inlet, 400 Passengers Aboard.

The barque, Victoria VII cleared from Cape Verde Island, and bound for New Bedford, Conn., was wrecked Friday night on the South East Point of the Inner Shoal near Portsmouth, as the result of an anchor dragging.

The barque was laden with whale oil and passengers, and had been out for thirty-eight days, when finding the water and provisions running short, the Captain signaled a pilot off Ocracoke Inlet, that being the first land sighted, took the vessel inside, where she was supposed to be safely anchored. Later on a gale rising, the anchor was found to drag, and all efforts to save the Victoria were of no avail, she was quickly blown ashore, where she now lies high and dry.

The crew, twenty-five, all told, and four hundred passengers, mostly Portuguese emigrants were saved by the crew of the Portsmouth Life Saving station, the passengers were taken to Portsmouth and cared for by the station.

It is expected that the ship wrecked people will reach here today, where they will take passage for their intended destination.

Capt Terrill and crew deserve the highest commendation for their brave work in rescuing the unfortunate people, for it was only by the most heroic of feats on the part of the Life Saving crew that it was done.

A party of gentlemen, Messrs Percy Cox, George Henderson, Jr., J Leo Burroughs, F F Matthews, H S Colbert, N C Hughes and H C Lumsden, of this city, went down to the scene of the wreck, on the tug W B Blades Sunday and carted provisions and other assistance for the stranded people.

IS DEAD

Only Living Son of a Revolutionary Soldier.

Alfred Moring, 89 Years Old. His History Could Not Leave Sunday. Capital Department Closed Memorial Day.

RALEIGH, May 11.—Mr. Alfred Moring, aged 89, the only living son of a Revolutionary soldier in this State died last night at the home of his son Mr. F. O. Moring here. Mr. Moring was born Feb. 26, 1814, in Surry county, Va. His father, John Moring, was born in 1768 and served as sergeant in the Third Virginia Regiment in the Continental Army. He was at the surrender of Cornwallis at Yorktown. Mr. Alfred Moring was the last child of a second marriage. When only ten years old his father moved to this State and lived at Moringsville, 20 miles from here. The father and son owned the stage coach line from Raleigh to Charlotte and had the contract for carrying all the government mail. A bond of \$10,000 was required from the stage drivers. This stage line was continued until the North Carolina railroad was built. When only twenty-one Mr. Moring married Elizabeth O. Kelly, the grand-daughter of Rev. O. Kelly, the intimate friend and class-mate of Thos. Jefferson and the founder of the Christian denomination in Virginia and North Carolina. Mr. Moring merchandised many years and went to New York, frequently when it required four days each way for the trip. He attended the First World's Fair which was held in New York. He heard Henry Clay speak in Raleigh, saw Franklin Pierce inaugurated and recalled many interesting events of that time. For more than fifty years Mr. Moring has been a deacon in the Christian church and for many years he was the treasurer of the Southern-Christian Church Convention. Three years ago he made a talk before the State meeting of the Sons of the Revolution and they requested his picture to place in their hall. He was ill only ten days and never lost his bright sunny disposition. His remains will be taken to Moringsville tomorrow for burial. He left four children, Mr. Frank O. Moring secretary and treasurer of the Caraleigh Mills here, Mr. E. C. Moring of Moban, Mrs. B. A. York of Denver, and Mrs. J. D. Edwards of Durham.

The object is to improve and make more attractive the school houses and grounds and to establish a library in each district.

We are all anxious for better schools and this is one way to get them. X.
