NEW SERVIAN KING.

Army Revolts, Kills King Alexander, The Queen and Queen's Brother. Cause of Uprising.

London, June 11.—Peter Karageorgevitch was last night proclaimed King of Servia. King Alexander, Queen Draga and the Queen's brother having been assassinated.

Prime Minister Sainger, Minister Marits and wife and commander of the palace guards were also murdered. All were murdered by the army which revolted and broke into the palace after midnight, having surrounded the square and overpowered the guards.

King Alexander, an expert swordsman, fought fiercely for his life. The Queen ran screaming, but was shot down.

The soldiers hold the palace, streets and forts, and have cowed the people thoroughly.

The unpopularity of King and Queen and lack of pay for the troops caused the revolt.

30 YEARS IN THE PEN.

This is the Sentence of Jim Wilcox For the Murder of Nellie Cropsey.

The Supreme Court of North Carolina today sentenced Jim Wilcox the murderer of Nellie Cropsey to the penitentiary for thirty years.

Nellie Cropsey was a beautiful girl seventeen years of age and had accepted the attentions of Jim Wilcox for some time, and it is said that she loved him ardently. Everything went along smoothly until a girl cousin of New York, paid Miss Cropsey a visit, when Wilcox transferred his attentions to the new girl and neglected his former sweetheart. This provoked some petty lover's quarrels, and presents were returned.

One night in November 1901, Jim called at the Cropsey home, but was treated very coolly by Miss Nellie. However, at his departure, he insisted that she accompany him to the porch, as he had some explanations to make which he wished to make privately.

She went, and that was the last seen of Nellie Cropsey until thirty-seven days later her dead body was found floating on the Pasquotank river. Bruises were on the head, as if made by some blunt instrument.

It was at once decided that the girl had been killed and certain circumstances pointed to Wilcox as the murderer, who was arrested as a suspect.

Wilcox's first trial, was in March 1902. In this trial, the evidence, as in the second one also, was purely circumstantial but nevertheless the jury returned a verdict of murder in the first degree and he was sentenced to be hanged.

The feeling was so hot against him that during this trial the spectators made a demonstration that the Supreme Court on appeal gave him a trial which was granted.

The case was moved from Perquimans county for the second trial. This occurred in February, 1903. This time he was convicted of murder in the second degree and sentenced to thirty years imprisonment at hard labor. From this judgment he appealed.
