### THIRD COLLISION SAME PLACE.

Lumbermen Light Infantry disbanded. Anti-Liquor Campaign to be Pushed.

Rahoon, June 19—The Lumbermen Light Infantry, which was Company 10 second regiment, was today ordered disbanded upon the recommendation of the Inspector General. It is the only Company disbanded as far as the result of this inspection which is now almost completed.

A charter is granted the Wampus Custom Mill Company, at Edinonton, capital \$100,000. The mill will split and manufacture goods. Of its stock J. A. Abernathy holds \$100,000, B. S. Abernathy \$20,000, and T. F. Costner, \$5,000.

This morning at Cary, where the tracks of the Seaboard Air Line and Southern Railway cross, there was a collision of freight trains, which wrecked two or three box cars and caused a delay of about half an hour. No one was hurt. It is the third accident of the kind which has occurred there.

The anti-liquor campaign here in Raleigh is being pushed with great energy. A series of lectures or talks is in progress, at which the attendance is large. There is an evident purpose to drive out the saloons.
