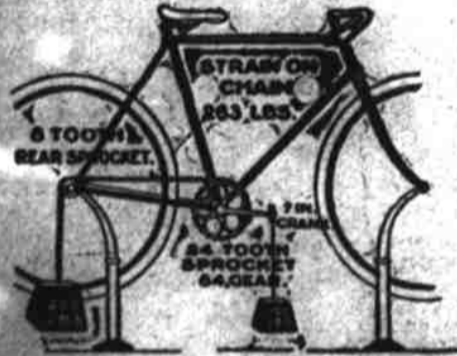

Notice to the Magistrates.

I am informed through the office of the Register of Deeds that a notice has been sent to the various Magistrates of the County notifying them to meet at the Court House at New Bern on the 4th of July next for the purpose of electing a Commissioner to fill the vacancy caused by the death of the late chairman, K. R. Jones. If this notice has been received by the Magistrates I wish to state that it has been issued without any authority of law, and by some one who is assuming to discharge duties which belong to the Board of County Commissioners.

If the Magistrates were to meet under such notice they could not elect a Commissioner because they were called together without authority of law. Section 717, Vol. 1, of the Code provides: "For the proper discharge of their duties the Justices of the Peace shall meet annually with the Board of Commissioners on the first Monday in June unless they shall be otherwise convened by the Board of Commissioners." There is no other way provided by law for calling the Magistrates together.

The County Commissioners at the proper time will call together the Magistrates to fill the vacancy above referred to. The Magistrates are further requested not to obey the call which has been issued by someone not having authority to issue it, and to wait until they receive the proper notice from the Board of Commissioners.
