ARE NOT WAGE BARNERS OVER DOING IT.

With strikes of various kinds throughout the country, caused by the demand for an increase of wages, and in many lines of trade wage concessions granted by employers, the question, from a labor point of view, is, how much more can be granted wage earners in an advanced pay with a decrease of hours of labor.

Manufacturers and contractors in most instances are agreed that wages are at their maximum today, and that no further increase can be given, and the manufacturer and contractor be able to do business.

It is not that the manufacturer and contractor have only the increase of wages to add in estimating new work, but there is an added cost of production to be figured in.

The greatly increased output in every line of trade, causes what can be claimed as an unusual demand for labor.

The wage earner has and is sharing in this demand for his labor. Work, with greatly increased pay, has been the wage earner's share in the prosperous conditions prevailing.

But the question now is, if the manufacturer and contractor feel that the maximum wage limit is reached, will not the wage earner over do it, if an attempt to secure further increased wages is made, with the ultimatum, if the advance is refused, that strikes will be the consequence.

The wage earner is self interested, in securing a maximum of wage for his services, for a minimum of time.

But while anxious to secure these advantages, there is a possibility of over reaching, with the result of making wage earners competitors among themselves, instead of being sought after, as they now are.

There is a maximum of success in every thing, and the fraction above it often brings failure. The wage earner can alone bring trouble to himself.

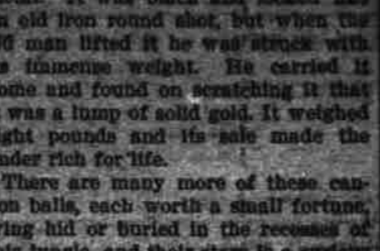
