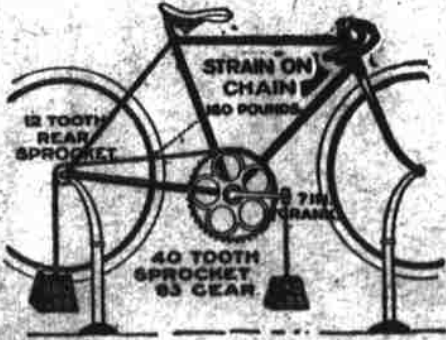

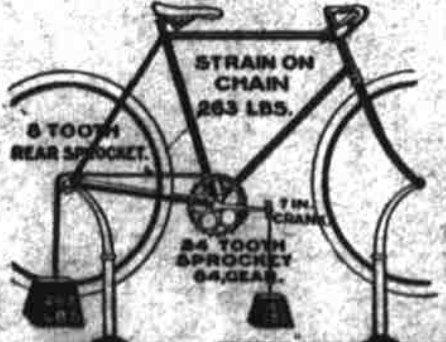

The man had been to the lodge Thursday night and complained of feeling sick. He was not seen by any one after leaving the lodge room but it is supposed that he felt too sick to get in his buggy which stood near.  
Hargett was a dock laborer and lived in James City. He was aged about 40 years.

### Lakes Always Fresh.

"There are in the state of Oregon two lakes that are frozen with from one year's end to the other," said L. G. Harper of Portland. "They were discovered in Baker county not very long ago by a party on a hunting and fishing trip in the mountains of the Panhandle district. A free passing through the party discovered the lakes on the north summit of one of the mountains in the neighborhood. The lakes are both small, one of them barely 150 feet across, with the other less than 1,000 feet in diameter. Both are covered with a heavy coating of ice as clear as crystal and as smooth as glass and of such strength that it held several members of the party who rode across on horseback. It is believed the ice never melts, because the lakes are so situated behind two peaks that the rays of the sun never strike them for sufficient length of time to make any impression."—Washington Star.
