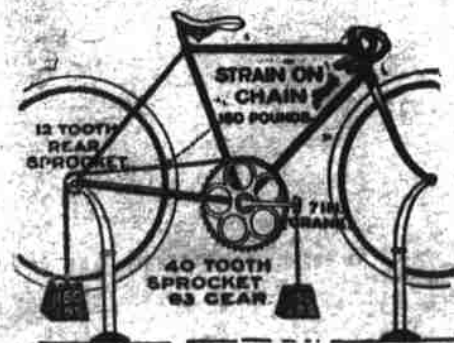

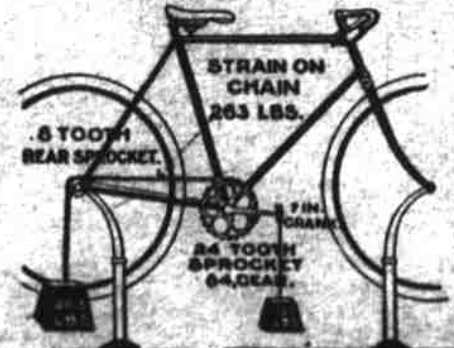

MRS. BLAINE DEAD.

Widow of the distinguished Statesman, James G. Blaine, Passes Away at Her Home in Portland, Me.

Mrs. Blaine died at the old family homestead on State Street, Portland, Me., Wednesday July 15th.

Mrs. Blaine's maiden name was Harriet Stanwood, the daughter of a leading citizen of Maine. She met her husband while both of them were teachers in a school at Kennebec. They were married at Pittsburg and later went to Augusta where Mr. Blaine became editor of the Kennebec Journal. She leaves one son, James G. Blaine, two daughters, Mrs. Harriet Peale and Mrs. Walter Damrosch, of New York, who were at her bedside during her last illness. She was seventy-six years of age.

The funeral will be at 4 p. m. Saturday in Portland and the interment will be in Washington D. C. Monday.

Carrin Foster is under arrest for violation of Postal Laws. Carrin Foster, a colored youth of nineteen years, living in this city, is in the county jail on the charge of having violated Section 1585 of the United States Postal laws. This particular section is relative to the defacing the offense of using cancelled postage stamps and providing the punishment therefor.

Foster was arraigned Wednesday on a warrant sworn out by F. W. Davis, post office inspector and issued by U. S. Commissioner C. B. Hill.

Foster's case was tried by Commissioner Hill yesterday morning and he was held for trial at the next term of the United States Court under \$100 bond.

Being unable to furnish security he was committed to the county jail.
