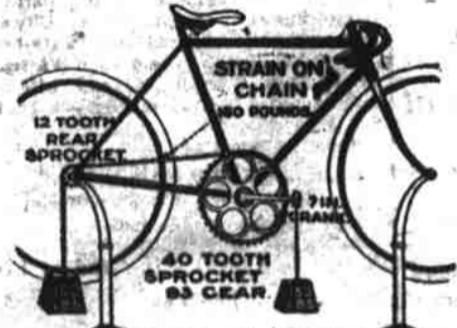

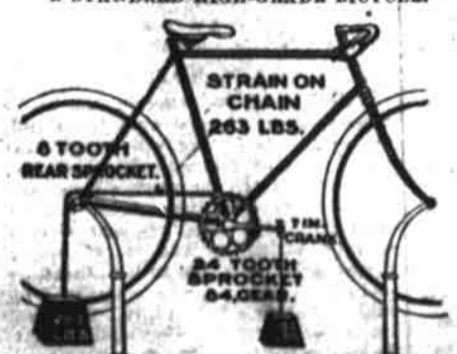

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Death of Dr. J. S. Long.

Baltimore Sun, July 16.—Rev. John S. Long, A. M. LL. D. who was widely known in Baltimore, having frequently preached here, died yesterday at the residence of his daughter, in Philadelphia. Dr. Long had been heard in recent years in Ohio's St. Paul's Association and other Protestant Episcopal churches. A few years ago he lectured in St. Peter's Church on "The Gift of the Tongue," before a large audience. He leaves many friends in this city.

Dr. Long was a great grandson of Bishop Long, of England, from whom he also descended. Three of the Bishop's sons came to this country with Lord Baltimore and settled in Virginia and North Carolina. Dr. Long was born in Washington, where he received his earliest education, later going to Randolph Mason College and graduating from the University of North Carolina in 1833. He was then admitted to the bar, and practiced law in the District of Columbia, the Supreme Court. He was almost immediately thereafter elected Solicitor of Washington, where he practiced law. He entered the ministry in 1850, and was stationed at Raleigh, Wilmington and other cities. His reputation as an orator and literary man is widespread, and he was known as a man of great profundity of thought. In 1866 he delivered the Confederate memorial address in Baltimore before an audience of 5,000 persons.

In 1895, by his eloquence and force, Dr. Long won a signal victory over Columbia University at the fraternity convention that met in Cincinnati to settle which should have the charter name Delta Kappa Epsilon. The North Carolina chapter was discontinued during the Civil War and the record destroyed. Columbia University established a chapter and taking the name, refused to relinquish it. In the convention Dr. Long spoke against Hon. Clarence Loxow of New York, and won the day after the delivery of a masterly speech. The degree of doctor of laws was conferred upon Dr. Long some time after his graduation by the University of North Carolina.

In 1898 Dr. Long married Miss Annie Bonner, grand-daughter of General Bonner, of Revolutionary fame, and a niece of Sarah Belden, William, the New England poetess. Mrs. Long died seven years ago.

Two daughters survive Dr. Long—Mrs. S. S. Willet, of Philadelphia, and Mrs. Wm. F. Post, of Forest Park. Mrs. Post is a writer of some note.

[Ed.—Dr. J. S. Long was for many years a prominent citizen of New Bern. Coming here directly after the Civil War he engaged in the practice of law, but gave it up in a short while to take up the educational work of the County. For over twenty-five years as Superintendent of public instruction, he devoted his time and talents to the organization and development of a school system for Craven county.

Dr. Long left here in 1901, going to Baltimore where he has since resided with his daughter.

The deceased had many warm friends in this section, who will no doubt be pained to learn of his death.

CASTORIA.

Sure it is, however, that there has been an unusual number of fights during a few days past. These unpleasantnesses have been confined to the colored population except in one or two instances.

Between 10 and 11 o'clock Thursday night the negro divisions of West street broke out in neighborhood warfare and there was a hot time in more than one sense. It is said the affray involved about all the colored people in the neighborhood.

The quarrel arose over an attempt of a woman to get a ring off another woman's finger. Whether the one who had the ring had a just right to it is not known, but she was able to keep it as she and her friends were the stronger party.

The principal feature in the row was noise but razors, sticks, pistols and every other weapon obtainable was in evidence and as a consequence there are a good many sore heads.

The police are working on the case but have made no arrests.
