PROSPECTS FOR LOCAL EDUCATIONAL ADVANCEMENT.

The foundation for the statement that there is a distinct gain in the educational advancement of this community, is not based upon hope, or upon the wish that such is the case.

The fourth annual report of the New Bern Public Schools, recently issued, is proof in its figures, that the educational progress of this city is a reality, that it is substantial in character and being furthered in its advancement by an increasing spirit among the people for still greater efforts and endeavors for educational life and progress in this community.

The annual report for 1906, of Superintendent Harding of the New Bern Public Schools, ought to be read by the parents of every family in this city, for it is a report affecting the home interests of every household.

It is not only in the good progress made in these schools during the past year, that interest should be taken in this report, but in acting upon its recommendations and suggestions, so that the next year may see still greater educational advancement in this community.

The stability of the educational movement in the public schools in this city, is seen in the fact that while a large enrollment of pupils is sought, there is no effort to gain in enrollment at the expense of inferior work.

This is the full term pupil's progress is not permitted to be sacrificed by the pupil who attends intermittently or near the end of a school term.

Especially in the High School Department has there been a high scholastic grade established and maintained, which cannot but prove of incalculable educational value.

But with the educational gains which are being made in this community, there must be no hesitation among those interested in education, if the future is to show a continued progress.

Public education in a community is a vital factor for its strength in social and material development.

It is a matter which concerns every household, which enters into every circle of society, of commerce, of religion.

Fire, flood and plague may demand sacrifices upon the part of the people of a community, but no sacrifice can compare in its lasting results and benefits, to the sacrifice made by a community for the public education of its children.

Higher equipped school rooms and more thoroughly equipped teachers, will pay for their work, supported by liberal funds from the local tax payers, means real educational advancement, and the people of New Bern should be inspired by the spirit of this kind, to get the really great results from their public school education, which means everything that is truly progressive for this city's future.
