The Second Regiment (3 Battalions), and New Bern Division of Naval Reserves Will Pass on Review Before Gov. Aycock Monday Evening at 6 O'clock at Camp.

THIS STATE AT ST. LOUIS.

Reported Interest Taken by Manufacturer and Others in an Exhibit.

Raleigh, July 20.—F. B. Arndall, who is one of the State agents to collect funds for the N. C. exhibit at the St. Louis Exposition, has returned from his first tour and says he finds interest among cotton mill men, furniture manufacturers and all owners of hardwood plans, tobacco men, and in fact all the manufacturers, deeply interested in having a great and complete exhibit. He says he now feels certain that the plan and arrangements are practically complete by which the State will be represented in very fine shape, better than at any previous exposition. In fact, and that the manufacturers and others will also have many notable exhibits.

From curator Brimley of the State Museum, during the absence of Secretary T. K. Bruner of the Agricultural department, who is now a very prominent official of the St. Louis Exposition, says detailed plans are now being made and that the packing of exhibits has begun, beginning with building stones, woods, etc.
