BE HAND FIGHT

So Say Farmers Against Tobacco Trust.

Splendid Treatment Soldiers by Wilmington. Report of Inspection N. C. Guard, Crockett Works, J. H. Fox Largest Income Giver in Ia.

RALPH, August 14.—The State Superintendent of public instruction is making up the notes for the loans to counties from the State education fund, these notes to be given to the State board of education for money to be used in building and improving school houses. Each week a few new applications for loans are received. These new ones will be taken up later.

Governor Aycock says he greatly enjoyed his visit to Fort Fisher, Carolina Beach and Wilmington, and that after the wind and the rain he feels that I can say: "I am a survivor of Fort Fisher." The Governor added: "Everybody had a good time. We were charmingly treated. The old soldiers never had a better day anywhere in their lives. I enjoyed the trip on the river and found Capt. Harper of the steamer Wilmington to be the prince of steamboat captains."

Work at the Methodist Orphanage here has been delayed considerably by the non-receipt of corrugated iron for interior and exterior work, but this material is now arriving.

Veterans who attended the Confederate reunion at Smithfield say it was a very fine affair. Charles M. Steidman, the orator of the day, made a fine impression. It was expected that he might allude to his candidacy for the nomination for Governor, but he did not do so. However, he has many warm friends and supporters in Johnston.

The report made by Major Newton, U. S. A., the officer who inspected all the troops of the North Carolina National Guard early in the summer is quite lengthy, and criticises freely but yet leniently with discrimination and accuracy. The troops in this state appear to be as well equipped, if not better, than any south of Washington. They have field equipment, including over coats, blankets, tents, cooking appliances, etc., and they all have new khaki uniforms complete. The officials are notified that a change is made in regular to the exchange of arms and equipments. The war department now calls in all the present calibre rifles and equipments, some 2000 in number, and will issue the new brass magazine rifles and equipments to the number of men actually enlisted, that is 1,000. All the rifles are understood to be on the way to Raleigh together with new cartridge belts, bayonet scabbards, etc. Requisition has been made on the war department for two 3.9 inch breech loaded rifled cannon for the light battery at Obolville. It is the purpose to equip this battery in the most perfect manner. All the batteries of the National Guard all over the country are to be equipped with the very best weapons made.

Mr. Blaine, from Pittsburg, Pa. is here in regard to the Crockett works, which are to be established either at Raleigh or in this section. This company was lately chartered in New Jersey, with a capital stock of \$250,000. It will use pine stumps and other fat lightwood. It will also make other by products of the pine.

The report as to the tax on incomes here shows that James H. Fox, attorney, gives in the largest incomes, \$11,000.

Chief Justice, Walter Clark, who was last year the only judge who returned his income made no return this year.

The cases of Federal officials who last year did not return their incomes, and who go again this year did not return them, may be before the state court.

The convicts have begun work on the extension of the Durham and Charlotte railway from Pittsburg northward up the New River towards Graham. The convict camp has been established at Pittsburg.

The Southern Farm Journal of this month pays a very high compliment to the monthly Bulletin of the North Carolina state board of health, saying that it is one of the most valuable publications of its kind in the country.

The farmers are in very good spirits regarding their crops except tobacco.

Not a few farmers say it is going to be very hard to get them to enter in a fight against the tobacco trust, and confess that no class of people are so hard to convince in an effort to do the farmers.

At the same time they admit that they they in vain they would be the most powerful force in America.

Diamond Shoals' Search Light Fixed.

Norfolk-Virginian Pilot, 18th.

The lighthouse board yesterday announced that the electric searchlight of Diamond Shoal light-vessel, No 71, on the North Carolina coast, which was reported disabled on July, this was repaired on August 6, and the light re-established.

During the early part of this summer, after having made numerous successful tests with the electrical instrument on the Pacific coast, and in the Orient the government installed an apparatus on the Diamond Shoal light-ship. The instrument throws a vertical white light toward the south, which light can be seen, it is said, at a distance of more than fifty miles.
