Meeting of The Board Aldermen

New Bern, N. C. Sept. 3, 1903. Board met pursuant to summons, Mayor Ellis presiding. Aldermen present, Hyman, Bangert, Dawson, Lane, Roberts, Phillips, Wood, McCarthy, Watson and Gulon. Minutes of previous meeting read and upon motion approved. Chairman of Fire Committee reported repairs on Station Engine was needed, upon motion Chairman of Fire Committee with Engineer was instructed to examine the engine and have necessary repairs done. Committee appointed at prior meeting to ascertain cost of Hook Crusher, reported that they had consulted with a Crusher Co. and got their figures for Crusher Engine and Boiler, all complete but asked to further investigate upon motion Committee was continued. Upon motion the Police Committee was instructed to ask for bids to furnish suits for Police, and was empowered to purchase same. The reports of Auditing Committee was read to the Board, upon motion was received and ordered recorded and published. Petitions from the different wards of City, signed by 454 citizens and petition signed by 618 ladies requesting the Board of Aldermen not to grant a license for any person or corporation to locate or run a liquor distillery in the city of New Bern, N. C., was presented to the Board and upon motion the petitions were received and ordered filed with City Clerk for safe keeping. Upon motion vouchers were ordered to each of hose wagon drivers pay for time off at tournament. The matter of granting license to Mr. John Fields Jr. to locate and operate a whiskey distillery under the two hundred dollar license, in the city of New Bern, N. C., was brought before the Board. Alderman Lane offered the following resolution, which upon motion was adopted, after which a motion was made to instruct the City Tax Collector to issue license to Mr. John Fields Jr. to manufacture and sell whiskey as prescribed in resolution. License was ordered by the following vote. Aldermen voting against license, T. G. Hyman, J. B. Dawson, S. G. Roberts, L. S. Wood and C. J. McCarthy, Aldermen voting for license, A. H. Bangert, S. H. Lane, E. W. Watson, W. S. Phillips, and B. S. Gulon. This being a tie vote the duty of casting the deciding vote fell upon the Mayor. The Mayor explained his views in the matter, and voted in favor of the license.
