When this is the case absolute silence is preserved during the meal, as it is a point of honor with the upper class composed of butler, lady's maid, groom of chambers, valet, housekeeper, etc. not to share household secrets with those below the salt, and also they have no mind to listen to the prattle of their inferiors. For subsequent courses the upper servants retire to the "housekeeper's room," where are spread tables and desserts superior to those provided for the others, and conversation goes on unchecked. At the present day this "housekeeper's room" is the scene of regular late dinners, at which visiting servants, if of the "upper class" are present. At the servants' parties, in order to avoid confusion, it is customary for them to adopt the names of their masters, so that while not dining and customers feast above, their guests dine below.

## A. & N. C. Betterments Equal Dividends.

Speaking about this Atlantic & North Carolina Railway, one of the largest stockholders declared that no president he thought, had done so much for it as Washington Bryan, who was appointed by Governor Seale. Bryan rerouted the entire road, substituting steel rail for the old iron. There was some debt at that time, but Bryan consolidated this with the debt for the rail and got all at a 5 per cent interest rate. This particular stockholder who was talking holds to the belief that in less than 50 years this will be a great property. The road's earnings have been spent for betterments and along this line the present president, Mr. James A. Bryan, has done a great deal. The stockholder declares that these betterments should be considered as dividends, and thinks that he is getting 8 per cent dividend on his stock, considering the rate at which he bought it. It is said that some years ago some of this stock was bought as low as 24 cents on the dollar, or \$3.50 per share. For the last year prices seem to have ranged from \$35 to \$37 per share, par value \$100. It is said that the talk of a lease advanced the price of stock to \$38.
