### MANDANUS PROCEEDINGS

To be begun in Matter of Distillery License.

The County Commissioners by a vote of 3 to 2, in their meeting yesterday, refused to instruct Sheriff Biddle to receive the county license in the matter of the Field's distillery.

Chairman Baxter cast the deciding vote, claiming that the citizens petition was the reason for his so voting.

Mr. Fields who has spent considerable money upon his plant here, will now institute mandamus proceedings against Sheriff Biddle to compel him to issue the license, as the law requires.

Mr. Fields claims that he has sought to avoid every disturbance of any kind in this matter of his, which he regards only as a business proposition, and has wished to keep out of all legal proceedings, but believing under the law he has rights, he will proceed at once, to institute mandamus proceedings, and compel a license to be issued to him.

### TWO THIRDS TOBACCO CROP.

How Price Has Fallen off. Future Outlook.

RALPHEN, September 8.—The best estimate appears to show that the tobacco crop this season is not over two thirds as large as that last year.

Secretary W P Batchelor of the Farmers Protective Association says that prices have fallen off so greatly that tobacco which sold last season at \$80 now sells for only \$7. He says there is no reduction of acreage this year. As to the holding together of the farmers in the fight against the tobacco trust, he says their attitude is very firm and that never was there such an effort on the face of the earth to get the farmers to become a unit. He has no doubt that by the time the next crop is planted that the farmers will be together and that there will be a very large reduction in the acreage.

### Winter in New York.

Malone, N. Y. Sept. 8.—A frost of unprecedented severity for this time of year occurred in the Adirondack mountains last night. The thermometer registered 33 degrees above zero. The corn crop is practically ruined. Ice was formed to the thickness of a quarter of an inch.

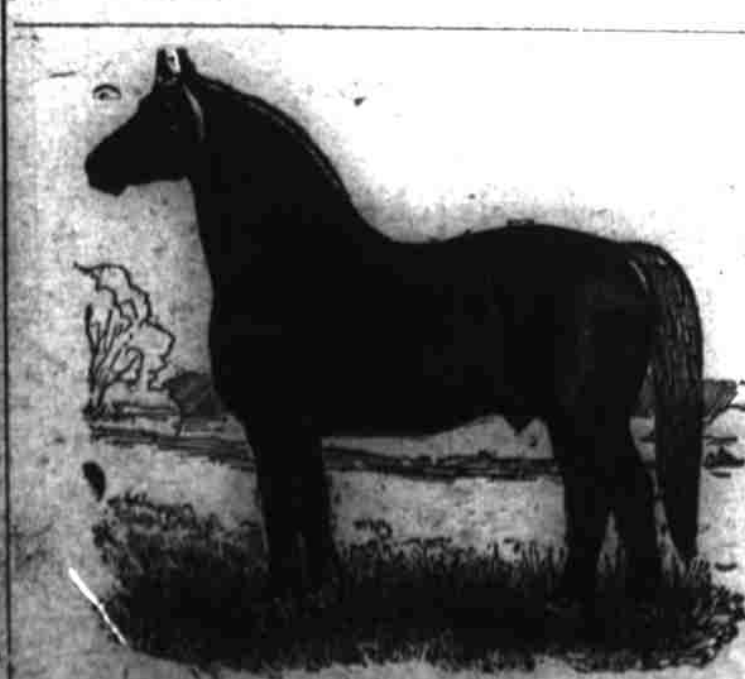
