THE NEWS IN A NUTSHELL.

The French Government is seeking to establish a protectorate over the North African states. It is not thought that their intention will be contested by the other European governments as King Edward is said to have consented.

The Mayorality contest of New York City is waxing warm and interesting. District Attorney Jerome has directed his fight against Mayor Low and is making a strong campaign.

A curious verdict in a murder case was rendered in Baltimore Friday. Frank Manley, who is alleged to have killed his wife during his sleep, Manley being subject to night-mare, was found guilty of murder in the second degree.

The Sultan of Turkey has requested United States Minister Edelman to ask that the American gun boats now in Turkish waters be called on in order that all appearance of war may be removed. The request will not be heeded unless the Porte complies with the demands of the United States.

The Panauky Indians, who have a reservation in New Kent county, Virginia, drew the color line on the negro population, declaring that they would not submit to registration with the colored people. They claim to be more intelligent and a better class of people than negroes.

Hugh C. Fry, the young North Carolinian, who recently attracted considerable attention while in the Naval Academy at Annapolis, by assaulting a negro waiter has been dismissed from the school, for the assault and other misdemeanors.

THE STATE'S CONVICTS.

Escapes Forfeit Good Conduct Time. Some Desperate Characters.

Raleigh, Sept. 26.—There are now 55 female State convicts, of whom 26 are at the State farm. Of the 29 remaining here, seven are white. The two white men, Modlin and Rice who hid in a loft for nine days and were finally found, have forfeited all the good conduct time they gained, this being three days in each month. To this five days is added for each 50 days gained, so it will readily be seen that good conduct is its own reward.

There are some very desperate characters in the penitentiary and there are three or four especially so who are ring leaders, although very quiet men to all appearances, three of these being murderers and another a safe cracker. Various rumors have been current during the past few weeks to the effect that some of the convicts had arms, but it is probable that the officials inspect their cells and persons so frequently as to guard against any such thing as this.

JUDGE FURNELL'S OPINION.

In Case Carolina Car Company. Corporation Commission to Investigate Railroad Accidents.

Raleigh, September 26.—Judge Furnell of the Federal Court, has rendered an opinion in the case of a bankrupt manufacturer here, the North Carolina Car Company. The opinion winds up the litigation, which has gone on for several years. At one time this was an important enterprise and built a good many cars, also furnished material for houses. Then it engaged in the manufacture of car wheels and soon afterwards failed.

The corporation commission will do all it can to investigate railway accidents, but few people have any idea of the difficulty of obtaining information about such things, as there are so many men who will not talk, some from distastefulness and others because of fear of loss of position, and that sort of thing.
