A NEEDED GOOD WORK.

That Being Instituted By the North Carolina Children's Home Society.

Plan of Operation.
Wm. B. Stricker, State Superintendent of the North Carolina Children's Home Society, was in the city yesterday in the interest of Society's work and reports that the organization in the State is progressing very satisfactorily.

While the society is now in North Carolina it has been in operation in other States for many years. North Carolina being the twenty-eighth State in which the society is working.

The object of the Society is to provide destitute and homeless children and to provide for them by placement in the care of good Christian families to remain till they are of age. Any destitute child under twelve years of age, resident of North Carolina, may claim the Society's services. After a child is placed in a family the secretary watches over it by visits and reports from responsible parties. The Society is non-sectarian, broadly charitable and thoroughly Christian.

It welcomes to its membership anyone wishing to aid in the cause of needy children.

The Society finds its special field for work with those children not cared for by existing orphanages, notably those under six years of age, and is meeting a hearty welcome.

The funds contributed, whether through membership, or the little collection boxes placed in various public places, are expended in finding homes for the children and their subsequent supervision. No child being placed out side of North Carolina except it goes to a relative. Active work in the State began Sept 1902 and five children have been provided with homes. They are several other little boys and girls are on the waiting list, ready to go into loving mothers' arms as soon as such offer them selves.

As the Society is a strictly charitable organization, dependent wholly for its support on the voluntary contributions of the people. It is hoped that New Bern will generously respond. Contributions may be handed Mr. F. S. Duffy or sent to the State Superintendent at Greensboro, N. C.

Pending the organization and securing of a charter, the Society is working under the authority of the National Society's charter, but is being endorsed by the most prominent people of the State. Among others who are generous and supporters we are permitted to mention:
