CONCLUDING SPEECHES

He made a powerful argument basing it entirely on the evidence of the defense's witnesses and declaring there was a case of murder unjustifiable.

Thomas M. Argo began the concluding speech of this great trial. He will finish tomorrow morning. He expressed his full belief that the Judge would not even charge that there was any probability of murder in the 2nd degree.
