### NOT ENOUGH NAMES.

Meeting of Board of Aldermen, New Bern N. C. October 13th 1903.

Recess meeting of the Board, Mayor Ellis presiding. Aldermen present, Bennett, Lane, Phillips, Wood, McCarthy, Watson, Gulton and Hollowell.

Mayor stated that the object of the meeting was to hear the report of the Committee appointed to investigate the matter of calling an election and any other business brought before the board.

Committee made following report:

To the Honorable Mayor and Board of Aldermen:

Your Committee appointed to investigate the petition calling for an election for school or no school. Beg leave to say that we have examined the Petition and find on it 200 names of which we find

215 are registered voters. 28 do not list on the registration book. 1 name appears three times in the petition, 10 names appears two times in the petition, 8 names we are unable to decipher. The total number of names on the registration books are 650.

To the Honorable Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of New Bern:

Gentlemen,—We, your committee appointed by the Mayor to examine the Petition of Petitioners asking an election to determine whether Bar-rooms shall be allowed to keep open in the City, do hereby report:

That we have thoroughly and carefully examined the registration books of the City, and have carefully and thoroughly compared the same with the Petition filed for the purpose stated, and after a full, complete and fair examination of the registration books and Petition filed, have ascertained and do now report, that there appears upon the registration books six Hundred and Fifty (650) names registered voters at the last City election, and find upon the Petition of names of Two Hundred and Five (205) actual registered voters.

And as we are advised that One Third of the registered voters in said City who were registered for the preceding municipal election are required to file a Petition for an election.—We therefore report, that not a sufficient number of Petitioners have signed such Petition. All of which is respectfully reported.

B. S. GUYON, A. H. HANSEN, C. J. McCARTHY, Committee.

Alderman Lane moved that the report be received and Clerk instructed to notify Mr Ward of the committee's finding.

Alderman Wood moved to amend Alderman Lane's motion, that the committee be instructed to receive the petition handed them for their investigation. Upon a vote the amendment was lost. Upon a vote the original motion was adopted.

The following petition was presented to the Board.

To the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of New Bern.

**PETITION.**

The Atlantic and North Carolina Railroad Company respectfully petitions your Honorable Body that a license be granted for the use and occupation by the track of said road at South Front street from the Western line of the Atlantic and North Carolina Railroad up to the mile of the Elm City Lumber Company.

This Company will contract and agree to keep the street on each side of said track in good order and condition, and will at all times keep said track to the level of the grade established for said street, and will otherwise regulate the use and occupation thereof in such reasonable manner and as this Honorable Board may require.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

Upon motion the matter was referred to Streets and Pump Committee and report at next meeting.

The matter of changing the name of the street from the independence of Alderman Gault and Roberts was taken up.

Alderman Bennett nominated Mr J. H. Smith to fill the vacancy of Mr Rhyne, and was seconded.

Alderman Lane, nominated Mr C. J. McCarty, to fill the vacancy of Mr Rhyne, and was seconded.

Upon motion the Board adjourned.

### IN FIFTEEN MINUTES

Jury Acquitted Haywood of Murder. Judge Complimented Jury's Verdict.

The jury was out only a quarter of an hour, when it returned with verdict not guilty.

There was no demonstration, Haywood's features did not change at the announcement of the verdict.

The Judge thanked the jury for the verdict and said he did not see how it could have done otherwise, that it was exactly what he would have done under the circumstances.
