Black Tulle and Lace



Black tulle and lace, which seems to be one of the trimmings that will lead this fall, and made up with black tulle and lace, makes a very effective and suggestive costume for the season. A pretty blouse made this autumn by making the best dressmaker have a pale, round, or none-of-very-heavy, or over the black tulle. Below the yoke the silk is shirred to a depth of three inches, thus giving a pretty fullness to the lower part of the blouse. The sleeves are gathered and tight fitting to the elbow, where they widen into a full puff and are finished with a cuff of Persian ribbon. The stock is trimmed with a band of the same ribbon, and just at the elbow is another band that gives a finishing touch to the sleeve.

Skirts and Petticoats

All woolen and cloth gowns are made without skirt fittings, a fashion which not only conduces to lightness, but to ease in walking. The newest skirt trimming is the gathered tick. These ticks are first attached to, then gathered and drawn into place. Its greenish, stamine or canvas suits tick trimming forms the heading or trim in the lace and is repeated across the waist and upon the top of the sleeves. A serviceable petticoat is made of fine cotton closely fitted to the gaiter part of the skirt, where a circular flange of the material is sewed on, having a two inch dust ruffle. This deep ruffle is covered with falls or ruffles of silk and this garment if not black is of a somber hue.

HINDOO CUSTOMS.

The Sword Plays a Prominent Part in Hindu Religion.

The sword plays a different role in Hindu religion and customs. There are certain wedding trices among Hindu oaths taken over the sword are binding, while taken otherwise they are not. A similar sentiment prevails among some predatory classes of Europe, where oaths taken over their weapons of offense—a dagger, a poniard, a rapier—are considered binding. 
