RAINER, Oct. 12.—The auspension which it is thought will be only tempor any of the Union Trust Company of Ballimore, appears to have revealed the fact as to the real backing of the Bouth and Western railway from the coal fields of West Virginia to Lincolnton, R C, thence to connect with the Seaboard Air Line. A large section of this road has already been built and even the people living along the line had no idea of its ultimate terminus. The road was built quietly with no votes of county or township bonds and paid cash as it went, there being apparently no bonded indebted being apparently no bonded indebted ness. ntirely in Baltimore. A deal was arranged with the Beab was to become the property of the Ess-board, but for some resson the arrangement was never completed and the road remained in the hands of the builders. 
