A GREAT STATE ROAD.

South and Western Road to go to South-
port. Union Trust Co. of Balti-
more The Backers.

RALPH, Oct. 22.—The suspension
which it is thought will be only tempo-
rary of the Union Trust Company of Bal-
timore, appears to have revealed the facts
as to the real backing of the South and
Western railway from the coal fields of
West Virginia to Lincoln, N. C., and
to connect with the Seaboard Air Line.
A large section of this road has already
been built and even the people living
along the line had no idea of its ultimate
terminus. The road was built quietly
with no votes of county or township
bonds and paid cash as it went, there
being apparently no bonded indebtedness.
Mr. George Blakiston, the Presi-
dent of the Union Trust Company was
the head of a road and it was financed
entirely in Baltimore.

A deal was arranged with the Seaboard
Air Line a year ago by which this road
was to become the property of the Sea-
board, but for some reason the arrange-
ment was never completed and the road
remained in the hands of the builders.
The project was to construct a line
from the coal fields to Southport making
the most direct line through North Caro-
lina, and to make Southport one of the
greatest coal exporting points on the
Atlantic Coast.

If the Union Trust Company is un-
able to resume operations the probability
is, are that this road will be built as
contemplated. This should give Char-
lotte and Wilmington and all the points
between very much cheaper coal for
their manufacturing industries and
should have a considerable effect on the
industrial development of the State. As
is well known, one of the principal
handicaps to manufacturing in this State
has been the high price of coal. The de-
velopment of Southport would give
North Carolina one port at which ships
of the largest tonnage could enter, and
might change the current of trade to a
large extent from Norfolk.
