COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Proceedings For November. Grand Jury Report. Supt. of Health and Treasurer Reports.

The Board met at the Court House November 2nd, 1903 in regular session.

Present Commissioners, Baxter, Wade and Harvey.

Ordered that Alex White be allowed to list and pay his poll tax for the year 1903.

On recommendation of the List Takers of No. 1 Township, it is ordered that the valuation of J. L. Causey's property in said Township be reduced to \$200, said property being on Pine Neck and listed at \$1,000.00.

Ordered that property of W. F. Moore at corner of Primrose and Attmore Sts. be reduced from \$650.00 to \$425.00, he having sold \$225.00 of said lot to Susan N. Dudley.

Ordered that Susan V. Dudley appear before the Board and show cause why her property at corner of Cypress and Attmore streets should not be listed for taxation for years 1903 and 1903, and why she should not pay double tax for failure to list same.

Ordered that A. M. Williams be requested to pay to Mr. S. L. Morris the sum of \$2.00 monthly in railroad tax for the year 1903, on account of poverty and infirmity.

Ordered that Wm. N. Nelson of No. 1 Township be relieved from payment of poll tax on account of poverty and infirmity.

Ordered that property listed to Rachel Bryan on Richardson Alley for \$200 be stricken from the list on account of error.

Ordered that \$750.00 solvent credits listed to Thos. M. Arthur of No. 2 township be reduced to \$75.00 on account of error.

Board took recess until 2.30 o'clock p. m.

The Board met at the Court House at 2:30 o'clock p. m., pursuant to the recess.

Present Commissioners, Baxter, Wade and Harvey.

Ordered that W. Y. O'Neil be allowed to list his taxes, he having failed to list at the proper time.

Ordered that \$400.00 (money on deposit) listed by Geo. M. Crapon be stricken from list, it appearing that same was listed by him through error.

Report of Dr. J. F. Rhem, Supt. of Health upon presentation was accepted and ordered filed and spread upon the minutes.

I have the honor of reporting that there has been a few cases of Diphtheria and Typhoid Fever reported for the month of October.

I also recommend that iron bed stands be placed in the county home.

ELECTION RETURNS.

Maryland Safely Democratic. New York Returns Unchanged.

The news from Tuesday's election, while the official vote is not yet given, coincide that Maryland is safely Democratic.

The returns from New York City show no change in figures from Wednesday's count, of about 61,000 plurality.

THE NEWS IN A NUTSHELL.

China has appealed to the United States to check the Russian advance in Manchuria.

A dispatch from Simla says that terrible earthquakes have occurred at Turshis near Turbatul-Aalard, in Persia. The entire city was practically demolished and 300 persons killed.

Sixty thousand fugitives from the Turks are said to be in danger of freezing and starving to death in Bulgaria.

It is reported that the German garrison at Warmbad, in German Southwest Africa, has been massacred by Hottentots.

Mrs. Thomas A. Hendricks, widow of the late vice-president is dead at her home in Indianapolis. She was born in 1833.

The new cable of the German Atlantic Cable Company between Emden and Fayal Azores, has just been completed. This is the first section of the second cable between Germany and New York City. The section between Fayal and New York city will be laid early in 1904.

The freak of two drunken young men named the Coney Island fire which resulted in one life being lost, forty persons being injured, five hundred being made homeless and the destruction of \$1,500,000 worth of property.

A surgeon named Von Manteuffel, at Dorpat, in the government of Livonia, recently removed a bullet from a woman's heart and the patient lived three days after the operation. The bullet had traversed her heart, but had not penetrated its larger cavity.
