### ARE BONDS LEGAL?

Issued to Wilmington, New Bern and Onslow Railroad by Comptroller Along Its Line.

Raleigh, Nov. 18.—W. D. Melrer of New Bern is here, looking through the original Journal of Legislature, in order to see whether the act authorizing the issue of bonds in aid of the Wilmington, New Bern and Onslow railway was constitutionally passed, that is, was read on three several days in each House.

He expects to find it was not, read, and to bring suit for one of the counties in interest, in order to nullify the bonds.

Announcement of the institution of such a suit will probably be made in a few days.

Official statistics give 18,000 as the number of Bulgarians killed since April 15th in the disturbances in Eastern Turkey.


