TWO IMPORTANT DECISIONS

Public Office Declared Personal Property. Other Similar Decisions. Special to Journal.

Raleigh, Dec. 2.—The Supreme court this evening filed a most important decision which over rules the noted case of Hoke against Henderson, decided in 1833, which held that a public office is the property of the holder during the term for which elected.

Associate Justice Connor delivered the opinion Chief Justice Clark filed a dissenting opinion. Associate Justice Montgomery filed a dissenting opinion. Associate Justice Douglas, who is absent, also dissents.

The case today decided in that of Mial against Ellington for the position of road supervisor in this county. The court declares that no office can have a property in the sovereignty of the State, that regarding legislative offices it is entirely within the power of the legislature to deal with them as public property may suggest and public interest may demand.

Col. Stokes Sward.

Raleigh, N. C., December 2nd;—Today the sword of Col. Montford S. Stokes was placed in the Hall of History. It is spent by his daughter, Mrs. C. N. Hunt of North Wilkesboro. It was presented to him while major of the First North Carolina regiment in the war with Mexico each one of the regiment contributing a dollar towards its purchase. Major Stokes was greatly beloved by the regiment. During the Civil War he was the colonel of one of the first North Carolina regiments to enter the Confederate service and was distinguished for his gallantry and ability. The sword is a very handsome one with a ruby studded hilt, the blade being inscribed in order to show how the gift was made.

Capt Glenn of Winston-Salem, states that he will stay in the race for governor until the finish.

The board of trustees of Trinity College has declined to request Dr Joe B Bassett to resign.

Senator Morgan who is in favor of the Nicaragua canal, says that he will fight the Panama canal treaty to the end.

Some of the cotton markets in the State sold cotton Tuesday for 19 cents a pound. That is more money than has ever been paid in gold before in this State.

Lord Mayor Sir Daniel Dixon, of Belfast, Ireland, gave a luncheon to Hon W J Bryan.

The United States Government has given directions looking to the recognition of King Peter Karageorgovitch of Serbia.

Colombians are awaiting the return of General Reyes from the United States should his report be unfavorable. It is said a guerrilla warfare will at once be started against Panama.

Governor Lanham, of Texas, yesterday raised the quarantine which has been enforced against Laredo since September 26th. Of 1,035 yellow fever cases, ninety-nine have resulted fatally.
