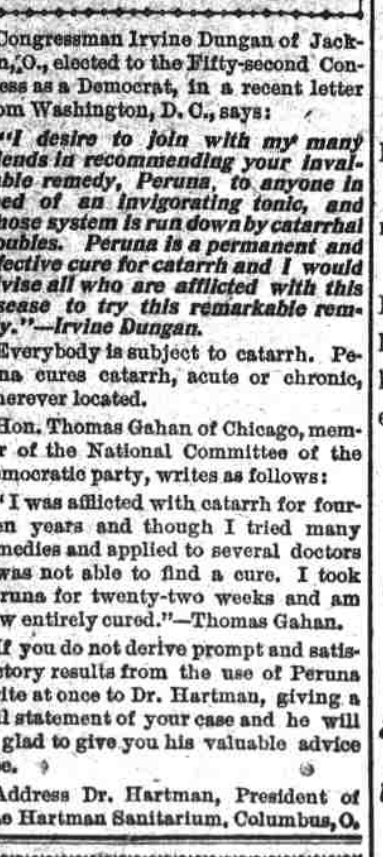
RALEIGH. The Poor to be Remembered. Good Report From State Farm. Judge Funnell is informed of the death of Mr Harvey Terry of Columbus, Ohio. He was one of the best known litigants in the Federal Courts here and in Elizabeth City, being interested or having been interested in timber lands in the northeastern counties. He had been here for years at every term of court. It is understood that the Junior Order of American Mechanics all over the country will petition the President to urge Congress to stop the evils resulting from the admission into this country of the vast hordes of ignorant, vicious, pauper immigrants of Europe and other countries. The local order here takes strong ground on this question. Superintendent Mann of the penitentiary has sold 600 bales of cotton grown on the state farm of the Roanoke River, the sales being made at Norfolk, at 18 cents. A great deal of very earnest work is being done among the poor here, by the Associated Charities, the churches, the Elks, and the saloon men. A house to house canvass is being made in the sections of the city occupied by poor persons. Senator Simmons is here, to remain until Monday when he goes to New Bern, where he will spend next week. The agricultural department officials find that there has been much more demand for agricultural literature this year than ever before, and more of it has been published. This is one of the many indications of improved farming. More farmers institutes are to be held next year than heretofore, as it is felt that these are growing more and more valuable. The attendance at and the interest in these institutes was much greater this year than ever before, this being very encouraging to Commissioner Patterson. The State charters the Carleigh Aid Society, which is composed of operatives of the Carleigh cotton mills in the suburbs of Raleigh. Clarence H. Pou, one of the brightest young men in this State, and who is making a reputation edit of North Carolina will continue to credit the progressive Farmer, which is now owned by a strong company, chartered yesterday.
