A NOISY CHRISTMAS

Pistols, Rockets and Torpedoes At State Capital.

Ten Convicts Draw Pardons For Christmas. Auditorium Again Alive. Prof. Massey To Lecture. Saloon Keepers Give Christmas.

Raleigh, Dec. 26.—The Capital was closed yesterday and today, the officials taking a two days holiday, this being largely because all the banks here closed for the first time, for two days. Governor Aycock was in his office and said he had spent a very pleasant Christmas. There was a Christmas tree at the Governor's mansion, and at six o'clock in the morning he and his wife and the seven children began the enjoyment of the day. The Governor said that during this week he had issued about ten pardons, mainly to penitentiary convicts, all these pardons getting to the prisoners in time for Christmas. All the pardons were specially recommended. He says this disposes of all the meritorious cases.

State Auditor Dixon left this morning for Thomasville to deliver an address before the Masons.

There has been a great deal of comment on the noisy and disorderly Christmas observance here. Mayor Powell said today he was earnestly in favor of suppressing any such thing in the future and that he also favored imposing the highest sort of a tax on all sorts of fireworks, before and during the holidays. He says most of the damage done was by rockets and torpedoes, which were used with extreme carelessness.

Professor W. F. Massey of the Agricultural and Mechanical College is to begin a series of eleven lectures before farmers institutes in Maryland, beginning January 4th. That state appropriates \$4,000 a year for these institutes and also pays a salary of the director.

Raleigh will have two systems of telephones, the Bell and the Raleigh. It will be the only town in the state with an independent exchange.

Rev. Dr. Cave, who over a year ago was called to the pastorate of the Presbyterian church here, is to arrive on the 7th of January.

Next week the auditorium directors and stockholders are to meet. About \$10,000 has been subscribed to the auditorium stock, of which only \$6,000 has been paid. The company bought the Academy of Music but has not of course paid for it.

The saloon keepers are delighted at the success of their great Christmas tree at Metropolitan Hall last night. The place was packed, the lower floor being devoted to the children, some 600 in number, who got the presents. The saloon men devoted the remainder of their association to this good purpose.
