The thunder is worse than the sound of a mighty battle. It bangs up against the moun-tain side and reverberates and rolls of into one ear splitting concussion after another until you, lying quaking in your tent, fully believe that the next valley in twain and land you in China

or some other scaport town.
I lay one night and with chatteri treth counted five distinct thunds storms come up to the edge of the pl storms come up to the edge of the plateau on which my tent stands and each time go through with an electrical performance that would give a stone man a dumb ague, and through it all not a copful of water fell on my tent. Later on to the night, when I had about regained something like my usual majestic caim of mind, it began to rote steadily, and the thunder and lightning didn't even whisper. They had doubtless gone off down the canyou, scaring some other poor tenderfoot half out of his wits. These electrical displays are not seemingly much dreaded by the people who live to high nititudes.
