Mr. Moore has resigned his pastorate at Chapel Hill and will begin his new duties February 1. His home and headquarters will be at Raleigh.

The Request for Side Track by Elm City Lumber Company Granted.

At a special meeting of the Board of Aldermen last night the petition of the Elm City Lumber Company, through its Secretary and Manager, Mr. Clyde Eby, and the Railway Company, was granted with unanimous consent.

The petition was for the construction of a side track from the A & N C track at South Front street to the Elm City Mills.

Mr. Ernest Green appeared before the board in the interest of Mrs. Styron, a property owner, and entered a protest against the measure. Mr. O. H. Galen appeared for the company. Mr. James A. Bryan made a few remarks favoring the building of the spur. Messrs. B. B. Nixon and A. Roberts made a few remarks against the proposition.

After a brief deliberation the board voted on the question with the above result. The matter was then put into the care of the committee on Streets and Lights.

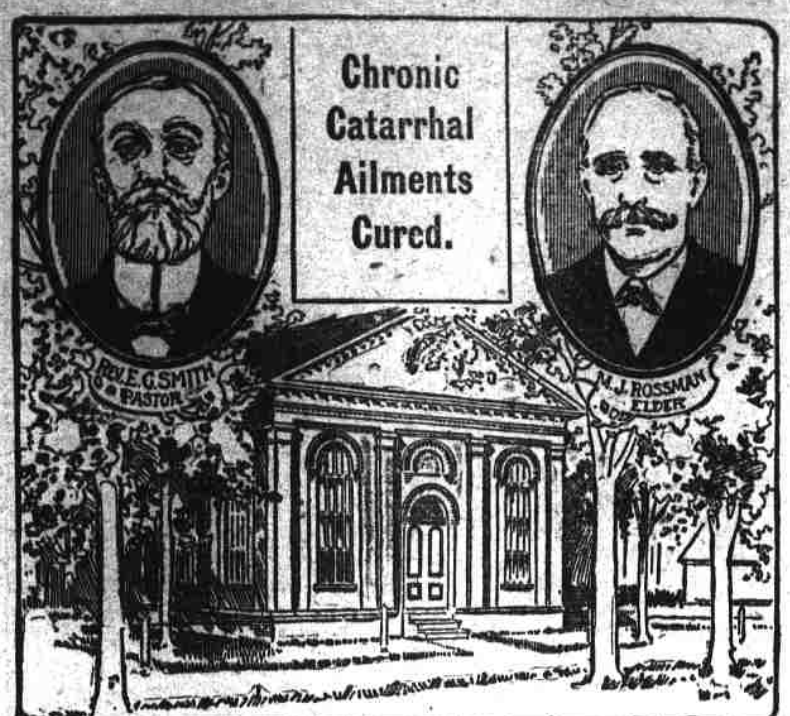
