RALEIGH.

Farmer Was Satisfied With Fifteen Cent Cotton.

Governor Aycock Thinks Parker Probably Nominee. Little Money for Walter Raleigh Fund. Wanted to Kill Murderer. Quaker Law.

Raleigh, Jan. 26.—Governor Aycock was asked today who he thought would be the Democratic nominee for president and said it looked like Parker. National committee man, Joseph Daniels, was asked as to who was North Carolina's favorite and replied that there was no choice and that he believed the delegation from this State would go unimpaired.

There are Democrats, and some leading ones too, who say they think a "dark horse" will win, and that the name of the dark horse is ex-Governor Patton of Pennsylvania. Their idea is that no one who has been in the strong center of politics since 1883 can be nominated.

Very little money is now coming in for the fund for the statue of Sir Walter Raleigh, which is proposed to erect here. Since July Treasurer Joseph G. Brown has received only \$37 50. For his fund, most of this having been contributed on North Carolina days, in the public schools. The total amount of the fund now in hand is only \$450.

Today Bob Briggs whose wife and child were murdered by Will Allen, came here and went to the sheriff's office. He expressed a great desire to see the murderer, but of course was not permitted to enter the jail. He would, if opportunity offered kill Allen on sight.

A well known farmer who lives here yesterday sold 30 bales of his finest cotton for \$1900. He remarked that only a few years ago he had sold three bales for \$100. He expressed himself as fully satisfied with the price, 15-cents, and said with a laugh that the farmer who would want more was very much like a hog.

This State keeps on hand a large quantity of paper, the law requiring it to supply this to the public printer, and the State Commissioner of Labor has fitted up rooms in the basement of the Supreme Court building in which the paper is now very carefully stored. It is a singular law which requires paper to be furnished, instead of allowing the printer to furnish it himself, but it is an old custom and it has been kept for all these years.

THE NEWS IN A NUTSHELL.

The flood in the Ohio river caused great suffering at Parkersburg, Wheeling and other points, the same conditions existing along other rivers in Pennsylvania and other neighboring States.

The World's Fair Buildings in St. Louis are now ready for the installation of exhibits.

It was reported that Col. Moses C. Westmore, of St. Louis, had made a provision in his will bequeathing about \$75,000 to the Democratic party for a campaign fund.

The fire which swept over Akensund, Norway, Sunday morning, destroyed every building in it with the exception of the hospital. The seven thousand inhabitants were compelled to camp in the open fields.

From all that can be gathered at this hour, between 180 and 190 men are lying dead in the headings and passage-ways of the Harwick mine of the Alleghany Coal Company at Oshwick, the result of a terrific explosion Jan. 25th.

With an empty pistol, Mrs. Gotwalk, wife of the warden of the jail at Northampton, Pa., prevents two prisoners, who had beaten her husband, from escaping from the prison.

A telegram from Belgrade reports that Servians and Montenegrins living abroad are engaged in a vigorous agitation against the Karageorgievitch dynasty.

Six blocks of frame houses at Sour Lake, Tex., destroyed by the Samco. Five also burns five brick buildings at Texarkana.

Literary circles of Boston are getting up a fund to be devoted to caring for the grave of Bill Nye at Fitcher N. C.

Secretary of Agriculture Wilson outlined his plan to exterminate the cotton boll weevil in Texas and the adjacent States.
