FOOD SHORT.

Reported That Supplies Are Needed at Fort Arthur.

Baron Hayashi's Remarks not Credited. Denial of Russian Defeat. Admiral Togo Blockading The Russian Loan.

London, Feb. 22.—A Fort Arthur dispatch says that Russian troops there and at Vladivostok are threatened with a food famine. At Fort Arthur the supply of provisions are so low that speculators are endeavoring to secure steam craft to run the blockade which the Japanese fleet has established. Daily is being drawn upon for a slim supply, but this does not relieve the situation. If the Japanese can land a force at Dainy, and cut off Fort Arthur by land, it will be impossible for the Russians to hold out long. Because of shortage of food all residents of Fort Arthur were sent away and the place occupied exclusively by troops. These are now being pinched for want of food. At Vladivostok the Russian government has ordered all civilians to leave because of scarcity of food.

London, Feb. 22.—Baron Hayashi, the Japanese minister to Great Britain, says that Russia is as unprepared for war as China was nine years ago, and that the troops of the Mikado will content themselves for the present with establishing a thorough organization and advancing gradually toward the Yalu river as the construction of the railroad from Seoul progresses.

This utterance of the Baron is not taken seriously as it is not like Japan to wait until Russia is prepared before striking a decisive blow.

Nagasaki, Feb. 22.—Officers of the German steamship, Stolberg, which has arrived here, say that the Russian Vladivostok Squadron was prevented from bombarding Hakodate in North Japan by a snow storm but the commander intends to make another attempt in March.

Tokio, Feb. 22.—It is reported that Admiral Togo has again attacked Fort Arthur. It is impossible to confirm the statement but the navy department says that it has no news from Admiral Togo today and it is considered probable that he has made an attack as he is engaged in blockading the Port.

London, February 22.—A report is sent today that the Russian 30 million roubles (\$10,000,000) loan will shortly be issued at 95 to 100. It is understood the Vanderbilt and other Americans are concerned.

St. Petersburg, Feb. 22.—The capital to wild over the reported Russian losses in a battle on the Yalu river. The government has officially denied that Russia has been repulsed by the Japanese, with a loss of twenty-five hundred men.

Shanghai, Feb. 22.—The Russian gun boat Mendjet has been ordered to leave this port, a Chinese squadron to enforce the order.

Here School Trouble.

The Journal has received a letter from one of its subscribers in Craven county in which complaint is made that the poor, or as he terms it "the laboring man's child," does not receive the attention or instruction in the public schools that should be given, and cites the school at his precinct as an instance where certain discrimination is made in teaching the poorer children, stating that some only receive one lesson a day.

This charge made by the correspondent is a very grave one and it is to be hoped overdrawn, and perhaps can be explained off.

At best, the school system is a difficult problem to handle, and those in charge very seldom have the encouragement or support of the public which they deserve.

The precinct referred to by the correspondent, is a large one, thickly settled, an unusually large number of children being enrolled for attendance at the public school.

The attendance is very irregular, and as a rule, school committees for purposes of economy base the facilities for teaching on a minimum attendance. In most cases this works all right, for people are extremely careless about sending their children to school. As has already been noticed in these columns, only last week, this writer visited a certain school with an enrollment of thirty pupils, and only four attendants, three of whom were children of the teacher.

This indifference about sending children to school is altogether among white parents, all the colored schools have a large attendance and are kept open regularly.

Several have been noticed by the writer in his travels, which were kept open on Saturdays the same as other days. The negro is taking full advantage of his educational opportunities. Knowing that education means citizenship for him, while the white man seems to be growing more indifferent about the matter all the time.

If the white parents don't take more interest in sending their children to school, a compulsory educational law will become a necessity, or the percentage of illiteracy among the whites will greatly exceed that of the negroes, which will be quite an unhappy condition of affairs for somebody.
