### FOR THE HOUSEWIFE

Shirts cannot be ironed properly with a common flatiron. It is better to purchase what is called a "push". This is a small iron with a flat point, the underside of which instead of being smooth is ground off in little diamonds, such the iron as a rubber tennis shoe. The iron should be very clean. It is better to rub them with stiff sand or both sides than to remove any possible rust, taking care to clean the sides as well. There is a piece of cloth on the fronting board to try the iron on, as well as a cloth with a small piece of wax to rub the iron occasionally and a bowl of water with a small piece of clean soft rag to wipe off the shirt-iron the neckband first, shaping it closely to the neck, then iron the cuffs, sleeves and the rest, and then the body of the shirt, and then the collar. 
