FEAR FINNS

Revolving, Russia Fortifies on Gulf of Finland.

Admiral Alexieff's Mistake. Japanese Invasion Corea Continues.

Small Fight. Japanese Disappears From Port Arthur. Coreans Compelled to Supply Russians.

St. Petersburg, March 3.—The War Office issues the statement that Vladivostok is not cut off, and the Trans-Siberian railroad between Harbin and Nikolai is intact. An attack was made on the railroad several days ago by brigades led by Japanese officers, which was repulsed. Vladivostok is well provisioned. Japanese fleet is seen in the distance where it remains.

Seoul, March 3.—Couriers from Ping Yang bring news of the Japanese and Russians being north of that town. The Russians appeared in force. The Japanese sent a detachment under Capt. Okasaki to meet them, when firing became general, the Japanese artillery on the town walls joining in the fight. The Russians retired leaving five dead, Major Liebta was captured. Eight Japanese killed, four wounded. Three hundred Russians were engaged.

St. Petersburg, March 3.—Owing to fear of internal troubles, the government has ordered the fortress on the Gulf of Finland to be put on a war footing, the families of the garrison being ordered to leave. The uneasiness is felt over the possibility of the Finns revolting.

It is believed here that Admiral Alexieff's mistake will result in the entire loss of the Russian fleet at Port Arthur, the lack of food and water making the fate of the garrison more uncertain.

London, March 3.—The Japanese are over running Manchuria at the head waters of the upper Yalu, and along the Yumen river. Feb. 19th, three thousand Japanese landed near Son Chin, between Vladivostok and Wonsan, and started across Corea, and are now believed to be at Samaru ready to attack Man Chiu Chow.

The Russians are alarmed at the disappearance of the Japanese fleet from Port Arthur. No knowledge of its whereabouts is known. The Japanese army massed at Ping Yan is said to be moving towards the Manchurian border, where the Russians are concentrated.

Seoul, March 3.—The Russians are compelling the Coreans to furnish them with fuel, food and fodder, and are fortifying Aishin to prevent the Japanese from crossing the Yalu river.

TO BE SET ASIDE

A & N C Receivability is Opinion State Official.

Raleigh, N. C., March 3.—Attorney A. D. Ward, of New Bern, assistant to the Attorney General in the case in which the State is seeking to set aside the injunction and the temporary receivership of the Atlantic & North Carolina railway, arrived today from Charleston, where yesterday he procured an order from Judge Simonton, of the U. S. Circuit court stating that the latter would be here March 19th to hear argument in this case.

Mr. Ward, reported today to Governor Aycock, and to Attorney General Gilmer. He says that Judge Simonton, stated that he would invite Judge Parnell, to sit with him in the hearing of this notable matter. The State officials are a unit in the belief that Judge Simonton, will set aside the injunction and the receiver ship.


