THE NEWSPAPER FAMINE.

A few weeks ago there was an out cry on the part of the public press, over the impending newspaper famine. That famine has become a fact, as every publisher must realize, for there is both trouble to secure newspaper at present, and an extra expense, as the price of news has advanced.

From all previous reports this famine has been the result of the well ordered program of the International Paper Company, which controls very largely the paper output in this country, this company curtailing its output so that the paper scarcity has been the result, and so an advance in price had to fol-

The International Paper Company is one of the protected industries, and controlling the majority of the paper out put, it can produce an artificial condition such as the present one, and appear perfectly innocent, but make the consumer pay an added cost for paper because it is scarce, which is an extra profit for the International.


