Legal Arrangement Made For Perpetuating Bingham School

Asheville Citizen, Feb. 25th.

A legal paper of unusual at the office of the Register of Deeds is a deed registered yesterday by Col. Bingham, transferring the Bingham School property to trustees, who at his decease, will transfer it to a corporation, the stock in which is to be equally divided between his heirs at law. By this means the school can go on with out legal complications, embarrasments or delays. Col. Bingham retains absolute control while he lives, and is using this method to administer on this very valuable property during his own life time.

His two sons-in-law, Major R. T. Grinnan, and Dr. S. E. McKee, and his legal adviser, Frank Carter, Esq. are the trustees named in the deed.

Major Grinnan, has been with the school for more than twenty years, and is vice superintendent. Dr. McKee, was with it for several years, both before and after it came to Asheville, in 1891. The Washburn Loan & Trust company is made executor of the will of even date with this conveyance, and referred to therein.

About half of the present landed property, all that it had at first, was bonded in 1891 for thirty thousand (\$30,000) dollars. Eighteen thousand (\$18,000) dollars of the bonded debt has been paid, and the conveyance charges the whole property, now consisting of seventy-five (75) acres and the improvements, which cost seventy thousand (\$70,000) dollars, with the remaining twelve thousand (\$12,000) of the school bonds, thereby greatly enhancing the security.

In connection with these wise provisions for the future of this famous institution, it is not a misnomer to say of its present and past that its area of patronage was never so wide, its income never so large, its equipment never so good, its location and climate attractions never so fine.

Before the civil war it could not accommodate all who wished to attend; but in order to do fuller justice to its patrons and its pupils, it declined to increase its capacity. After the civil war it more than doubled its capacity to accommodate its steadily increasing patronage. Of late it again cannot accommodate all who wish to attend; but it again declines to increase its capacity, refusing pupils instead.

Col. Bingham's age sits so lightly on him that he will not need a successor for many years to come. When the immediate succession must be provided for it is well provided in Major Grinnan, and Dr. McKee, singly, or in conjunction. Col. Bingham's son, Robert W. Bingham, now of Louisville, Ky., was connected with the school for several years; but greatly to the regret of its many friends in Asheville and elsewhere he is now so wedded to the legal profession that he will probably not be connected with the school again otherwise than as an adviser.

But Col. Bingham, is carrying on the work of his grandfather, and there is no reason why his two grandsons and granddaughters shall not carry on the work which he has done more than all his predecessors to make work continuing and it may be a matter of public interest that his two grandsons are being reared with this end in view.

By the legal arrangements just effected everything which human foresight can do has been done to perpetuate the South's oldest and most successful school for boys, and to transmit it under greatly improved conditions, to future generations of Binghamans.

NO MEDIATION.

Russia Will Fight and Win Victory.

Russian Fleet Still Outside of any Harbor. China Notified Depredations of Bandits Must Stop or Russia Nullifies Treaty.

St. Petersburg, March 8.—Concerning the report that Russia wished for mediation in the war with Japan, a high official says—"The idea is preposterous, the war will continue until brilliant successes had been attained by Russia, and efforts will be made to concentrate an army for land victories."

It is thought here that the Russian Vladivostok fleet, and the Japanese fleet which bombarded the harbor on last Sunday, are near each other down on the Korean coast, and that a battle is imminent.

London, March 8.—The Japanese fleet will remain near Vladivostok to prevent the Russian fleet from returning, as all other harbors are frozen and the Russian ships must soon return for coal.

The Russian Minister at Peking has notified the Chinese government, that unless the depredations of bandits, who are cutting the telegraph poles and destroying property in Manchuria is stopped, Russia's neutrality with the Chinese will be nullified.

Russian scouts have reached within 60 miles of Gossau.

London, March 8.—Cabling from Ping Yang, under the date of March 6, a correspondent of The Daily Mail says that 3,000 Russian cavalrymen, with seven guns, retreated last Wednesday through Kuang and Gouchon, toward Wiju. They destroyed telegraph lines.


